Saying Goodbye to Mother Angelica

Our whole Priests for Life family was saddened to learn of the passing of Mother Angelica on Easter Sunday. We have all lost a friend, a mentor, a spiritual mother, a voice of conscience, and a source of laughter and encouragement.

In my frequent visits to EWTN, I was often privileged to say mass in her room, sometimes with Fr. Joseph, and other times just with Mother and the sister who attended to her. One of the many special aspects of these visits was that I would always bring with me the first class relic of some of the blood of Pope St. John Paul II. This relic was entrusted to me and Priests for Life by Cardinal Stanislaw Dziwisz, who served as Pope John Paul II's personal secretary throughout his pontificate, and before.

I knew that the sisters prayed fervently to Pope St. John Paul II for Mother Angelica each day, and that therefore this would be a very meaningful gesture not only to the community, but also to Mother herself, who although unable to speak, was very aware of her surroundings and her visitors.

I remember in particular at one mass reflecting about how I was simultaneously in the presence of the Eucharistic Lord, the relic of John Paul II, and another saint still living on earth. Not exactly an everyday experience! I was eventually able to obtain an additional first class relic of John Paul II for the sisters to keep there permanently.

Now as it happened, the last time I celebrated mass in her room was exactly two weeks before she died. It was Sunday, March 13, and after having the mass, talking with those who were attending to her, and blessing her with the relic of John Paul II, I began to leave.

But as I was walking out the door of Mother's room, the sister attending

to her called me back. **"Father,"** she said, **"come back, Mother is saying goodbye to you."**

And I turned to see her ever so slowly raising her left hand in a gesture of waving goodbye. It was not easy for her at this point to move her arms, and she had never made that gesture in the past as I left. So I blessed her again and told her how much everyone was praying for her. And then, of course, the Lord called her home on Easter.

The experience of the funeral liturgy at her Shrine in Hanceville was most inspiring. I got there early on that sunny Friday morning, April 1, and decided to mingle out on the plaza with all the faithful who were arriving little by little from places near and far. I connected with people there that I had not seen in years, but who, on the other hand, were very connected with me and with the others who have the privilege of broadcasting on this network that Mother founded.

The dominant emotion was gratitude, as we all smiled and recounted for one another how thankful we were that Mother spoke the truth so courageously and followed God's will so trustfully. We were thankful to God for the vocation he gave her, and thankful for her willingness to do what seemed crazy and impossible.

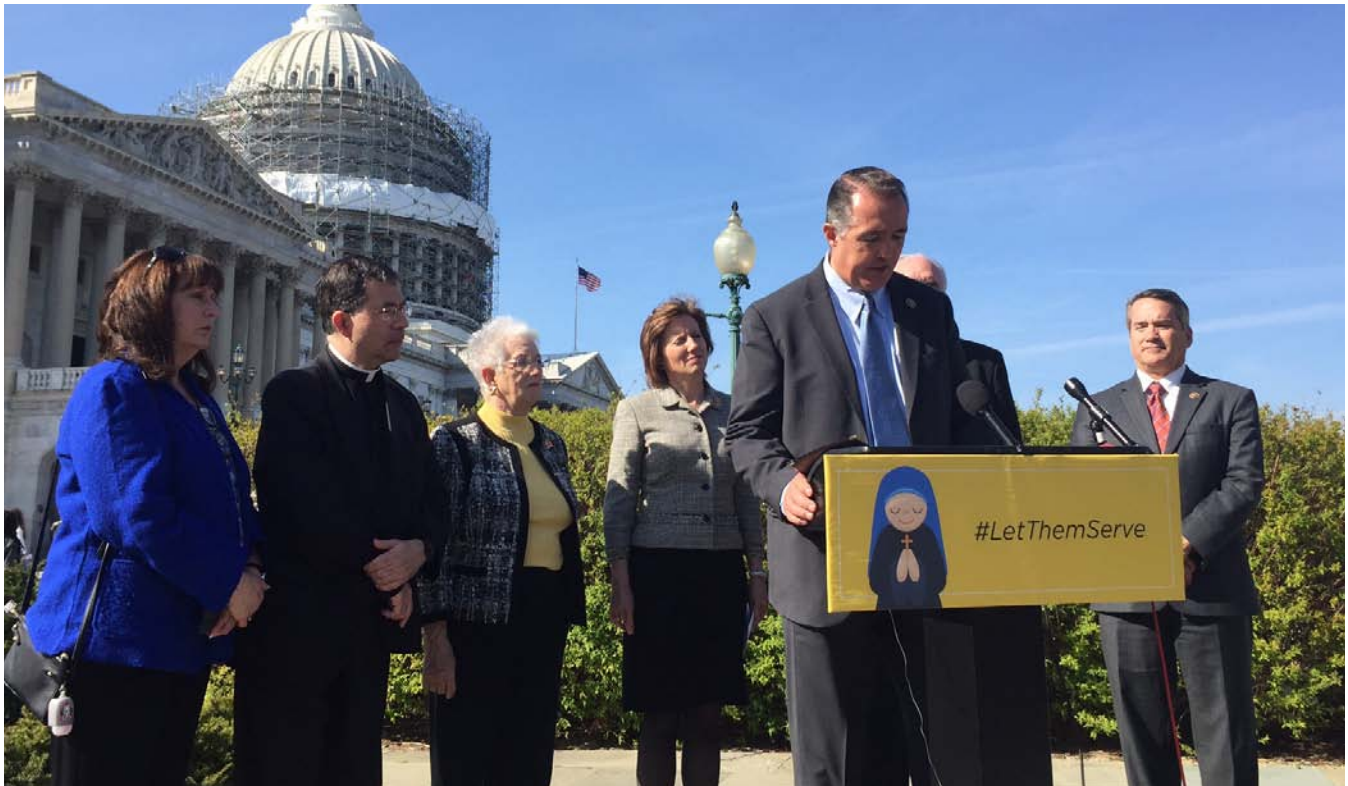

Before the mass, I went up to the casket, which was still open, and blessed her one last time. I whispered some words of gratitude to her for having asked me personally, back in 1994, to begin taping for EWTN a TV series on abortion. The series, *Defending Life*, airs on EWTN to this day, and we just taped 13 more new episodes.

Mother Angelica's voice and her message will be with us for a long time. Thanks to the continued growth of the media apostolate she founded - an apostolate in which we eagerly participate - people will be able to learn and laugh with Mother Angelica for many years to come.

Priests for Life Executives Join Members of Congress for Press Conference As Supreme Court Hears Priests for Life Case



On the day before the oral arguments for our Priests for Life vs. HHS case at the Supreme Court, along with our own press conference held at the National Press Club, I was invited - along with Janet Morana our Executive Director (and also a petitioner in the case) - to stand with members of Congress, led by Congressman Trent Franks (shown here at the microphone), as they addressed the press outside of the Capitol Building.

I have worked alongside these members of Congress for many years on matters related to abortion. As we chatted prior to and after the formal remarks, we were all expressing the dismay that so many of you share that our nation has come to the point where bishops, priests, and nuns have to go to the Supreme Court to battle with the government over our freedom to practice our faith on American soil.

All the members, in talking with me, also expressed their gratitude for Priests for Life, for the work we do, and for our lawsuit against the HHS mandate. I told them that our staff in Washington and throughout the country are ready to continue to assist them in their crucial work.

With several of the Congressmen, I also discussed the work of the Select Panel on Infant Lives and how Priests for Life is assisting in the investigation of the abortion industry.

My walk across the Steubenville Campus

At least once each academic year, and sometimes more, I have the joy of visiting the Franciscan University of Steubenville, and of celebrating mass for the students and speaking to them about the progress of the pro-life cause. And my visits there always remind me of the impact that Priests for Life is having across the country.

Take, for example, the day I was walking across campus, and at one point a male student approached me and excitedly and said, "**You are Fr. Frank Pavone, right?**" I said, "**Yes,**" he proceeded to thank me for the work of Rachel's Vineyard, which is a ministry of Priests for Life and the world's largest program for healing after abortion. He explained to me that his parents went through a Rachel's Vineyard retreat to mourn the loss of one of his siblings to abortion.

That healing experience for them, he said, extended to the entire family. He was keenly aware of the wound that the abortion of his sibling caused to him and to the dynamics of relationships within the whole family, and was also very aware that when this is faced openly and honestly, with the power of God's word, the sacraments, and the solid psychological basis for Rachel's Vineyard, the healing that can occur is invaluable.

I told him how much I appreciated him sharing this, and promised that we would keep his family in prayer and that we would do everything possible to make sure that the healing work of Rachel's Vineyard continues to reach as many families as need it.

Then I walked along a little further and encountered a professor who thanked me profusely for the resources that Priests for Life provides in articulating the pro-life message. He explained how he utilized a lot of our materials for his own research and for his presentations to his students on this topic.

And then, arriving at the other end of campus, a vehicle that was coming up the driveway where I was walking suddenly stopped and I noticed the driver gesticulating wildly. She called me to come over to the car, right there in the middle of the road, and began telling me how much she appreciated the political outreach of Priests for Life and how vocal I am in the media when it comes to the duty of citizens to vote in elections.

She proceeded to tell me that she was a relatively new citizen of the United States, and that thanks to the strong messages of our political outreach, she was motivated to register and had just voted for the first time in a United States federal election.

I could not possibly put a price tag on this kind of encouragement, totally unsolicited and reaching across such a diversity of our activities as a family of ministries. 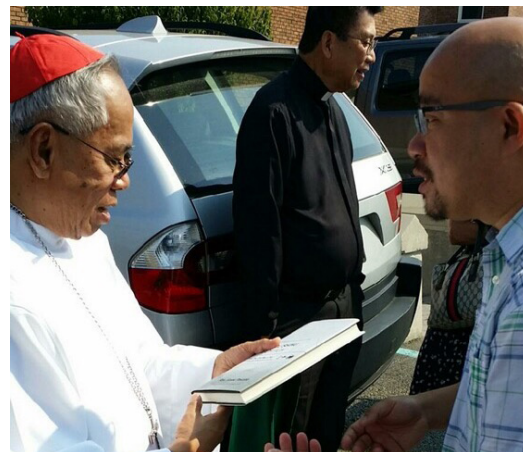
