On February 28, 55 members of the US House of Representatives signed a "Catholic Statement of Principles." They claim to be "committed to...protecting the most vulnerable among us." An Appeal to our Public Officials

The Catholic Church, and we as Catholic priests, are pro-life in the most comprehensive sense of the term. We proclaim and call our people to work for a just society that safeguards human life and dignity at every stage and in every circumstance. All life issues are interconnected, and one cannot claim to respect life at one stage but throw it away at another.

That is why Pope John Paul II, in *Christifideles Laici*, declared, 'Above all, the common outcry, which is justly made on behalf of human rights -- for example, the right to health, to home, to work, to family, to culture -- is false and illusory if the right to life, the most basic and fundamental right and the condition for all other personal rights, is not defended with maximum determination' (n. 38). That is also why the United States Bishops wrote in 1998: "The failure to protect and defend life in its most vulnerable stages renders suspect any claims to the 'rightness' of positions in other matters" (*Living the*

Gospel of Life, n.23).

To all Catholics in public office who want to be committed to protecting the most vulnerable among us, we appeal today: *Take to heart the words of the bishops and the Holy Father, and do not exclude unborn children from the vulnerable people you want to protect!* As priests committed to a consistent ethic of life, we applaud every effort to advance human dignity. But we likewise oppose the attempt of some in public office to soften the contradiction between being Catholic and being “pro-choice” on abortion. Tolerance of abortion not only contradicts the Catholic Faith; it also contradicts the American way, which is one of equality for every human being, and likewise contradicts human decency, which stands against all forms of violence. There is simply no excuse for a public official to fail to call for the protection of the lives of the youngest infants.

Three New Full-Time Priests on Staff!

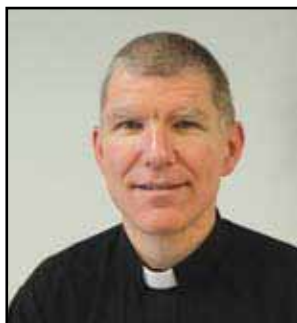
Fr. Frank Pavone, National Director of Priests for Life, announced recently that three additional priests have joined the Priests for Life pastoral team: Fr. James Marshall, a Jesuit, Very Rev. Patrick Healy, a Josephite, and Fr. Dennis Weber, a priest of the Servants of Charity. Fr. Marshall and Fr. Healy have been given permission to work with Priests for Life on a full-time basis. Fr. Weber has begun working with us on a part-time basis. All of them will assist in proclaiming the pro-life message in parish visits nationwide, and ministering to the pro-life movement at events to which they are invited. This brings the number of our Priest-Associates on staff to ten, nine of whom are full-time.

In this newsletter, we will get to know Fr. Marshall a little better, and will have the biographical sketches of our other new Priest-Associates in future issues.

BIOGRAPHY FOR FR. JAMES A. MARSHALL, S.J.

Fr. James A. Marshall, S.J., was born and raised in El Paso, Texas, and entered the Society of Jesus in 1991. He was ordained to the priesthood in June of 2003 and served in parishes in College Station, El Paso, and Spring, Texas, and Albuquerque, New Mexico. He is currently a priest associate with Priests for Life.

Fr. Marshall earned a B.B.A. in Business Computer Systems from New Mexico State University and

first heard his priestly calling as a graduate student at Texas A&M University. As a Jesuit scholastic, Fr. Marshall earned a M.A. in Philosophy from St. Louis University and a M.Div. from the Jesuit School of Theology at Berkeley. He spent three years as a theology teacher at Jesuit College Preparatory School of Dallas, Texas, and a year as a chaplain resident at Parkland Memorial Hospital in Dallas.

Fr. Marshall became interested in pro-life work during his years of theology studies in California. The shocking realities that nearly half of all Bay Area pregnancies ended in abortion and that the casualties of the *one-day* tragedy of 9/11 were but a fraction of abortion's *every day* casualties (multiplied by 365 days a year over many years) stirred in him an urgency to work in this area.

In his short time as a priest, Fr. Marshall has spent many hours on the sidewalks by abortion facilities in the cities he has worked, counseling women and men and praying. He was a weekly guest on a Spanish-speaking radio talk show whose focus was abortion and has helped organize Rachel's Vineyard and other post-abortion retreats, as well as retreats for Project Gabriel and other pro-life volunteers. Fr. Marshall has served on the board of Fertility Care Services of El Paso, an organization that promotes the Creighton Model of natural family planning; he believes that the spiritual principles of St. Ignatius' *Spiritual Exercises* are a potentially indispensable tool for fighting the battle against the culture-of-death.

In a profound way, Fr. Marshall has experienced his work with the poor, the handicapped, the imprisoned, and youth as Christ's invitation to enter into His wounds. These deeply loved children of God are some of His most neglected and so reflect the image of the crucified Christ Himself. Fr. Marshall yearns for the day when God's *most* abandoned and despised children, the countless holy innocents aborted in the womb, will be reunited with their mothers and fathers at the Lamb's Wedding Feast.

Seminarian Pro-life Conference

Every summer, Priests for Life sponsors a national pro-life conference for Seminararians. This year, the conference will be held from August 18-24 in Amarillo, Texas, at the new headquarters of Priests for Life and the newly-formed *Missionaries of the Gospel of Life*. Most Reverend John Yanta, Bishop of Amarillo, will speak about why he is a bishop who is also a pro-life activist. Fr. Frank Pavone will share the insights he has gained from 13 years of preaching about abortion every day across the nation. Other national experts will come to speak about healing after abortion and new initiatives in the pro-life cause.

Those who attend the conference are welcome to stay for an evening celebration on August 24th that will include the Groundbreaking Ceremonies for the new facilities of the *Missionaries of the Gospel of Life*, the first Society of Apostolic Life dedicated exclusively to ending abortion and euthanasia.

Priests for Life, in conjunction with the Pontifical Council for the Family, invites you to attend the *World Meeting of Families*, to be held in Valencia, Spain from July 1-9, 2006. This world gathering is called by the Pope every three years to celebrate the divine gift that is the family. It brings together hundreds of thousands of families from the five continents to pray, talk, learn, share and go into depth on the understanding of the role of the Christian family as a domestic Church and basic unit for evangelization.

His Eminence, Alfonso Cardinal Lopez-Trujillo, has been on the Priests for Life Advisory Board of Bishops since its inception.

Be a Lay Affiliate of the Missionaries of the Gospel of Life!

Priests for Life has established a new community in the Church, the *Missionaries of the Gospel of Life*, which trains priests, deacons, and laity for pro-life ministry. Along with those who live in community, we also have *lay affiliate members* who, make certain commitments to prayer, personal study, and pro-life work to the extent that their duties permit. We provide opportunities for local gatherings in which they learn the spirituality of the Society and gather with other people who are making a similar commitment.

For some throughout the pro-life movement, there is a sense of isolation from the local Church, particularly when there isn't the leadership or encouragement that should be available at the parish level. Pro-life activists are sometimes made to feel like "outsiders."

With the establishment of our new Society, however, as an official "Society of Apostolic Life," the blessing and support of the Church will be felt in a new way and pro-life activists will be affirmed in what they are doing by their unity with other members of the Society.

You can do the pro-life work you do now as a lay member of our new Society!

This new Pro-life Society is a direct **response** to the call issued by John Paul II in *Evangelium Vitae*: "*What is urgently called for is a general mobilization of consciences and a united ethical effort to activate a great campaign in support of life. All together, we must build a new culture of life*" (EV, n.95).

The members of this Society witness before the Church and the world to the priority of the right to life as the foundation of all other rights, and to the absolute claims to respect and protection that this right makes upon every individual and community in the human family. **The Society promotes and defends** the natural human right to life, in the light of the Gospel, **focusing in particular** on ending the scourge of abortion.

The members of our Society undertake a process of spiritual and pro-life formation, and then make special promises to defend human life and to collaborate with the Society by following its spirituality and sharing its mission to the extent that their duties allow.

Members participate in four overarching spiritual disciplines:

Prayer: Each member is committed to praying specific daily prayers as provided by the Society, and leading an active sacramental life.

Study: Members, individually and corporately, will be expected to participate in ongoing study and formation in Scripture, Church teaching, and pro-life educational materials.

Community: Members are expected to be faithful members of a local parish and to gather with other Society members as possible.

Witness: Members give of their time to the pro-life cause.

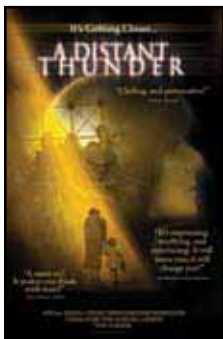

A Distant Thunder



There are pro-life people who work in Hollywood, and two of them – Jonathan and Deborah Flora – have created a new tool to help the American people wrestle with abortion. “A Distant Thunder” is a powerful new 35-minute film that combines courtroom drama and supernatural warfare to help reveal the reality of what abortion does to a baby, and to the baby’s mother. The film helps the viewer wrestle with the issues and their

implications, but is not presented in explicitly pro-life or religious themes. What it does, instead, is to help the viewer touch some of the aspects of the abortion issue that the other sides tries so desperately to cover up. In touching these painful and often scary facets of the issue, the viewer has the opportunity to let the light of conscience and compassion inform his or her conclusions.

The court case is about a partial-birth abortion that went wrong. The abortionist is on trial, not for having done a partial-birth abortion, but for what he did when the procedure went awry. One of the key witnesses is the nurse who witnessed the abortion. She testifies to how the procedure takes place, and to what went wrong this particular time. The nurse’s eyewitness testimony reveals to the jury the incredible details of a partial-birth abortion. In the film, the reaction of the jury to these details is predictable. They are disgusted and horrified, as are the American people in general when they hear about this procedure. The reaction of the defense attorney is also predictable. He objects that it is unnecessary to relate these graphic details in the courtroom. This brings to mind a scene from “Judgment at Nuremberg” when, after a film is shown

in the courtroom of the indisputable horror of the Holocaust, the defense argues that it is inappropriate to show such graphic imagery in the court. Similar objections were made in the halls of the US Congress when the diagrams of partial-birth abortion were shown during the debates about whether to ban it. Defenders of evil always want to hide what it looks like from the eyes of the public.

The film concludes with a surprise ending that brings together the human, divine, public, and personal aspects of abortion. Without a doubt, A Distant Thunder will become one of the most powerful tools to assist people to re-evaluate abortion.
