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Winning the Battle – But Losing the Peace

My dear friend Julie Woodley, who is the founder of *Restoring the Heart Ministries*, recently shared a note with me that she received in response to a newsletter about her post abortion ministry. The note reads:

“Planned Parenthood is stronger and more powerful than you! We have more money. We have more power. And we will win!”

Rarely is the spiritual battle of choice and its undeniably negative effects on women, men and children so clearly delineated by this quote from someone at Planned Parenthood. Gone is the rhetoric about “freeing women” from their unplanned pregnancies; Forgotten are the mantras about choice and independence.

We have more money. We have more power. And we will win.

My question is this: What will you win? Bigger profits? More prestige? A bigger, shinier facility? As the devastating psychological and physical effects of abortion are brought to light, it certainly isn't the women and children who are winning in this fight!

No matter what side a person or organization finds themselves on in this “battle,” there used to be some comfort in thinking that at least, however misguided, our opposition was doing what they believed was right to help women. This statement shatters that illusion. It's not about mothers facing unplanned pregnancies. It's not about establishing a woman's right to give life. It's about “Winning.”

Planned Parenthood is stronger and more powerful than you.

Indeed, Planned Parenthood has a dreadfully large budget and astonishingly strong political influence. As individuals, we have little hope of doing much to alter what they do. But we who truly help women are backed by an even greater Authority. As we work to give mothers and fathers the healing they need so that their future is not dictated by the trauma of previous choices, we aren't worried about *winning*. We are here to serve. We are here to share in the mission of Jesus Christ, who comes to bless those who mourn and to conquer all injustice through the power of love. With this as our goal, we will never lose!

Total Reconciliation

Dear Friends,

Our relationship with God involves constant repentance, an ever-new and vigorous turning back to Him and away from the many things that can take us away from Him. This journey from sin into holiness is real, and involves moments of joy as well as of pain.

As in any relationship, there can be certain areas in which we reconcile with the other person, and others that, at the very same time, still constitute an obstacle to the relationship. If there is need for reconciliation, there may be a need to work on several areas, one at a time, until total reconciliation is achieved. The reconciliation is total only when both persons are satisfied that they have been reconciled. Something may be bothering one person that the other is totally unaware of. Perhaps a word was said or omitted or a need unmet and one person felt offended while the other did not realize the problem.

So, in our relationship with God, there may be areas where we still need reconciliation with Him but do not recognize the problem. Full reconciliation occurs only when all the areas of sin in our lives are recognized and addressed.

Sometimes, in the course of healing after abortion, we may come face to face with some other aspect of our relationship with God that has to be healed and reconciled. This can be a particular challenge if, at the same time that we confront this other area of sin, we are making progress in accepting forgiveness for the abortion. The joy of making progress regarding the abortion can make it harder for us to recognize our need to be reconciled in other areas. Perhaps the problem is an invalid marriage, or a failure to practice our duties of worship, or a spirit of unforgiveness toward someone who has hurt us. Our relationship with God is one, and while we are healing in one area, we may be stalled in another.

There is no easy way around this problem; it requires humility, and a constant readiness to entrust ourselves to God and to repent over and over again. The good news is that as we find victory in him over abortion, we can find victory in him over every sin that burdens our lives. It should not surprise us that our reconciliation with God is a constant task, because it is a relationship – and every relationship demands constant hard work. But the good news is that whatever further work of repentance is needed, God will provide all the light and grace and strength we need to do it.

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Become a Lay Affiliate of the Missionaries of the Gospel of Life!

Fr. Frank Pavone has established a new association in the Church, the *Missionaries of the Gospel of Life*, which trains priests, deacons, and laity for pro-life ministry. Along with those who live in community, we also have [lay affiliate members](#) who, make certain commitments to prayer, personal study, and pro-life work to the extent that their duties permit. We provide opportunities for local gatherings in which they learn the spirituality of the Society and gather with other people who are making a similar commitment.

Very simply, whatever pro-life work a person is already doing can now be done in the context of the spiritual commitment to belong to this Society, and with the special blessing of the Church which such membership brings.

For some throughout the pro-life movement, there is a sense of isolation from the local Church, particularly when there isn't the leadership or encouragement that should be available at the parish level. Pro-life activists are sometimes made to feel like "outsiders."

With the establishment of this new Society as an official "Society of Apostolic Life," the blessing and support of the Church will be felt in a new way and pro-life activists will be affirmed in what they are doing by their unity with other members of the Society.

This new Pro-life Society is a direct **response** to the call issued by John Paul II in [Evangelium Vitae](#): “*What is urgently called for is a general mobilization of consciences and a united ethical effort to activate a great campaign in support of life. All together, we must build a new culture of life*” (EV, n.95).

The members of this Society witness before the Church and the world to the priority of the right to life as the foundation of all other rights, and to the absolute claims to respect and protection that this right makes upon every individual and community in the human family. **The Society**

promotes and defends the natural human right to life, in the light of the Gospel, *focusing in particular* on ending the scourge of abortion.

The members of our Society undertake a process of spiritual and pro-life formation, and then make special promises to defend human life and to collaborate with the Society by following its spirituality and sharing its mission to the extent that their duties allow.

Members participate in four overarching spiritual disciplines:

Prayer: Each member is committed to praying specific daily prayers as provided by the Society, and leading an active sacramental life.

Study: Members, individually and corporately, will be expected to participate in ongoing study and formation in Scripture, Church teaching, and pro-life educational materials.

Community: Members are expected to be faithful members of a local parish and to gather with other Society members as possible.

Witness: Members give of their time to the pro-life cause.

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Book of the Month - Empty Arms

In 1993, a group of concerned citizens in Chattanooga, Tennessee, succeeded not only in closing down the city's abortion clinic, but also in purchasing the building where it had operated. Soon afterward, the National Memorial for the Unborn opened on that site and over the last several years has become a special place for remembrance and healing. **Empty Arms** tells the story of the memorial and the many lives that have been touched through its ministry.

Empty Arms contains 58 letters telling the real stories of mothers, fathers, and grandparents who have been a part of a crisis pregnancy that ended in abortion, and now deeply regret that decision.

Each story shares how visiting the memorial helped them release their secret shame and finally live in freedom.

Empty Arms also includes ten stories of adoption to encourage this life-giving alternative, even in difficult circumstances. An additional section lists resources such as crisis pregnancy centers, online post-abortion ministries, and locations of other memorials to the unborn.
