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Wounded Healers

"In Love's service, only wounded soldiers can serve." Thornton Wilder

In the play "The Angel That Troubled the Waters," based on John 5, author Thornton Wilder dramatizes the power of the pool of Bethesda to heal people whenever an angel stirred its waters. The angel says, "Without your wounds where would your power be? In Love's service, only wounded soldiers can serve."

One of the greatest joys discovered as a result of healing is the freedom from having to live a lie. When we come into truth, we face the reality of our own brokenness. As a result, our healing gift can then be shared with the community. If we conceal our wounds, out of fear or shame, our inner darkness can neither be illuminated nor become a light for others. But when we dare to live as forgiven men and women, we can become a wounded healer, and draw others into that same life with Christ.

Never was this truth so apparent as during the testimonies shared during The Silent No More Awareness Campaign and Operation Outcry Testimonies. Georgette Fourney, co-founder of Silent No More, shared: "We are making History. HIS STORY is really God's story." Indeed, the blessing of God's love, the power of forgiveness, and the story of healing and redemption. Those who have experienced this reality were the front line soldiers during the March for Life.

They lift the veil on the secret and tragic reality of abortion. In doing so, they share their healing gift with the world. We affirm these brave and courageous voices. We stand together in solidarity. We appreciate their truth as an illumination for those who are tempted to walk the same path. May their voices grow in harmony and lead many more women and men into the light.

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Shedding a Light on the Truth of Abortion

“You mean you *didn’t want* to have an abortion?” Her question pierced my heart. WOW, I thought, she doesn’t know. Of course I didn’t *want* my abortion. I had no choice.

But how could she know? Who would expect her to? Only recently have women like me, women who have had abortions, begun to speak out more and more. Only recently have our stories and the REAL truth about abortion been revealed to shed a new light and allow the truth to be told.

I was 19 when I had my abortion. I was living at home and torn between two worlds. My home life was a mess. My father was abusive. I was scared and on edge most of the time. But in my other world, I was smart, and somewhat attractive and popular. I felt special and my boyfriend made me feel special. One day, these two worlds collided. I had conceived a baby and the father

was willing to marry me. Somehow I knew in my gut that could never happen. Not because of him, but because of my father.

My father would kill him. And it was very apparent when I told my mother and she said, “Your father will kill you” that I would be killed too. Now, for most families, the words “Your father will kill you” means hide in your room or give him a couple of hours to cool off. Unfortunately in my case, the message was literal. I knew my father would kill me *and* my boyfriend. But that wasn’t what I was worried about. I was worried that he would take it out on the person who always got the brunt of my father’s attacks, my mother. And I couldn’t bear to be responsible for that. So, I had no choice. I had an abortion.

Now, trust me, no one knows more than me that it was ME that walked into that clinic and that it was ME that killed my baby. Not a day goes by that I don’t think of my daughter and the fact that I have not been able to conceive a baby since. I won’t go into details of the abortion. Suffice to say, it was hell. The truth is, I had to push the memory of it down in order to survive. Only one memory stays with me. Me, the doctor and some woman standing over me in a very large empty cold room with large windows. As I felt the life being sucked out of me tears flowed down my cheeks like a faucet that wasn’t shut off. I looked toward heaven and sang out loud a song from Godspell “I Don’t Know How to Love Him.” I knew I wasn’t loving Him, or my baby. What I realized later was how much I wasn’t loving myself.

When I walked out of that abortion clinic, two new worlds emerged in order for me to live with what I had done. In one world I was a successful, driven businesswoman who cared greatly for others, and who, by the grace of God, began a journey back towards fullness in my faith and activity in our church. In my other world, I carried the emotional, physical and spiritual scars of a secret for 25 years. A secret I felt could never be revealed or accepted by my other world. To me, our faith saw abortion as the sin of all sins, and those of us who committed one as being completely selfish and void of any love for our baby and our fellow human being. In my mind there was no way these two worlds could be reconciled.

But one day these two worlds collided. That was the day I heard about Rachel’s Vineyard, a weekend retreat that offers healing and hope for men, women, anyone, who has experienced the pain of abortion. This time I said yes to heaven instead of hell and attended a Rachel’s Vineyard retreat. Rachel’s Vineyard gave me back what I had lost 25 years before. There I found compassionate caring people who understood what I had been through. For the first time, I could share my secrets in a very confidential environment. Many wounds were healed on that weekend. I experienced a weekend retreat that to my surprise was a Catholic retreat. The same faith that I was afraid would never understand was now healing my wounds with their love. Rachel’s Vineyard helped restore my relationship with the only person who could completely heal my brokenness and make me whole--Jesus. This time, I came to Him for help. And this time, God gave me a brand new world. A world where His love, His forgiveness and His peace now reign. I now live in one world. His world.

And I dream of building His world, a world where, like the Good Samaritan, we all see and help heal the wounds, the wounds our brothers and sisters are carrying around as a result of abortion.

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Book Review: Redeeming A Father's Heart

I was introduced to "Redeeming A Father's Heart" back in November while attending conference Reclaiming Fatherhood in San Francisco.

My original intention was to read this book on my flight back to New Jersey, however after reading the foreword by Fr. Pavone I knew this book required my full attention and the airplane was not exactly the right place for me to harness that sort of concentration.

"Redeeming A Father's Heart" is a "must have" resource on men's post abortion grief and healing. To begin with, there are not that many books out there addressing the issue. This particular work of Kevin Burke and his coauthors David Wemhoff and Marvin Stockwell deserves special attention.

We are constantly being fed by a lie that decision to abort should remain between the woman, her doctor and her god. But men participate in that decision, albeit not always in plain leveled field. Some men, escaping restorability, seek or demand abortion. Some are just being "supportive" in her decision. While others witness helplessly as abortion being done against their will or even discover the fact after everything is over. All these men deserve our attention. Especially, when they discover the courage to step forward and talk about their ordeal and share their stories of healing.

If you are a man that has participated in abortion, this book will change your life. If you are a priest, a counselor, or maybe just relative or friend of a post abortive man, this book will help you to appreciate the process of grieving nearly every post abortive man goes through on their path to healing. It will also help you to connect the dots and to see how some destructive behaviors maybe connected to men's past involvement in abortion.

I would highly recommend this book to the leaders of AA groups. As well as to any other group or counseling service that helps others to overcome their addictions. All these addictions may

very well be the result of serious spiritual and psychological trauma connected to their abortion experience. Men that shared their stories in the book, speak for millions of men around the world.
