Taking the Lead: Rachel Vineyard's Training Conference in Leeds, England

The Rachel's Vineyard Training Conference in Leeds, England this past month was a great success! Deacon Charlie Connor and his brother Fr. Augustine Connor, CFR of the Leeds Diocese shared that the quality of the presentations, the information and inspiration far exceeded their expectations and was exactly what they needed to help organize and expand the Rachel's Vineyard outreach in England.

The Conferences were well attended by religious, with great representation by the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal, and we also met the Sisters of the Gospel of Life, founded in the Diocese of Glasgow, Scotland in 1997 by the late Cardinal Winning. Representatives who serve on Rachel's Vineyard teams traveled from Cork, Ireland; Belfast, Northern Ireland; Novara, Italy, Scotland, and Amsterdam, Holland and cities throughout England.

The conference opened with words of support from The Right Reverend Arthur Roche, Bishop of Leeds, expressing his endorsement of the work of Rachel's Vineyard and the goals of the conference to educate

and equip clergy, professionals and laity to better understand the trauma of abortion and provide effective healing responses.

The first day offered special clergy training with 30 priests from across England and Ireland attending. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive, a common response being:

"We had no idea how pervasive this problem is...and how important it is for the Church to be at the forefront of a compassionate and effective response given the numbers of people hurting after abortion." The following days offered clinical training for clergy, laity, professionals and those serving on Rachel's Vineyard teams.

Kevin and Theresa presented on abortion trauma, the impact on men, couples, families and the science and spirituality of the Rachel's Vineyard healing programs that have proven so effective in treating this complicated grief. Janet Morana gave presentations on the Silent No More Awareness Campaign and introduced Margaret Cuthill who serves as a Regional Coordinator for Silent No More in the United Kingdom.

Eucharistic adoration was held throughout the conference and daily mass provided the important foundation for all our study and fellowship.

Following the Clinical training, Janet Morana and Theresa Burke traveled to London where they gave a seminar for clergy in the afternoon and a public lecture in the evening. These events were sponsored by the the Good Counsel Network, a London women's center that provides resources for women facing unplanned pregnancies.

A Note from the Pastoral Director

Dear Friends,

As I shared during our recent RV training conference in Malvern, PA, the identity of Rachel and the meaning of "vineyard" have very profound roots in Scripture. Both tie into the very identity and history of God's chosen people Israel. (Israel, in fact, was the husband of Rachel).

That identity and history is of a people who were specially chosen, planted and nurtured by God (like the owner tending the vineyard), who were terribly unfaithful, who were rightly chastised by God for their offenses (being brought to the depths of distress and despair), and then were redeemed by that same God with the promise that they would have a future full of hope. That passage of promise contains the reference in Jeremiah to the weeping of Rachel for her children.

Each RV retreat is a microcosm of this history and hope, a gathering of God's people who have been nurtured, have sinned, have been chastised, and are now being given new hope for healing – a hope that blossoms into a new identity as branches on the True Vine who is Christ Himself.

Our profound Biblical identity should give us even greater confidence as we promote and carry out this ministry of Rachel's Vineyard. As Cardinal Rigali told us in July, this work is at the very heart of the Church – and that's true because it's at the very heart of Scripture!

2009 Catholic Social Workers National Association Conference

In July 2009 I had the great joy of attending the Catholic Social Workers National Association (CSWNA) Conference in Louisville, Kentucky. From their mission statement:

The mission of CSWNA is to promote the implementation of Catholic social teachings in social work practice as we support competent professional social workers living out their baptismal call by being the hands and feet of Christ.

The National Conference provided and opportunity to come together to network, advance in knowledge and practice and most importantly to pray together. Each day began with rosary and the great blessing of having Archbishop Joseph Kurtz, the Episcopal Moderator for CSWNA celebrate Mass for the participants. What a joy to pray the rosary and receive our blessed Lord in the Eucharist with social workers who share a common love for the Lord, his Blessed Mother and the Church! The presentations were informative and inspiring and I was honored to share about our Christ-centered healing programs of Rachel's Vineyard, a ministry of Priests for Life and Grief to Grace healing the wounds of abuse. Keynote speakers included William Donahue of the Catholic League and Archbishop Kurtz.

One particular presentation by Kathleen Belanger, Ph.D., MSW, and Philosopher Owen Smith Ph.D., provided an excellent intellectual foundation and educational model that in a special way reflected the heart and mission of the CSWNA. A special charism of this organization and its vocation in the Church, is to assist in the formation of social work professionals who labor in the many ministries of Catholic Charities and the other programs found in diocese and parishes to assist the poor, homeless, elderly, infirm and families and to defend human life from conception to natural death.

We learned that do this most effectively, our professional values and practice must be grounded in the sound teachings of the Magisterium of the Church and personal prayer and regular reception of the sacraments. In addition, Dr. Belanger and Smith helped us to understand that if we are to successfully negotiate the challenging social and ethical issues we encounter in everyday practice and in the institutions we labor in, we need to have a strong foundation in philosophy and ethics to assist us. This is

especially true when our ministry touches upon the responsibility to support the teachings of the Church in the areas of the sanctity of human life and family life. The model offered by Drs. Belanger and Smith is one that I hope will be embraced by the Church in the training of social work and related professionals who are involved in her many ministries.
