

Rachel's Vineyard Leadership Conference a Success!

The 2011 Rachel's Vineyard Leadership Conference proved to be an enormous success! The conference was hosted July 18-21 at the Malvern Retreat Center in Malvern, PA in partnership with Priests for Life and the Silent No More Awareness Campaign. With over 220 participants, it was the largest leadership conference in Rachel's Vineyard history!

Participants came from all around the world to attend the conference. Australia, Jamaica, Canada, Singapore, Austria and Uganda were just some of the countries represented, not to mention 34 out of the 50 U.S. states. The feedback from participants has been overwhelmingly positive on the keynote speakers and the workshops as they learned new skills and strategies to engage in successful post-abortion ministry. More importantly, they experienced the support, fellowship and joy that is at the heart of those serving in the Lord's vineyard.

This year, participants were offered advice from professionals with a wide array of expertise, including Fr. Frank Pavone, Teresa Tomeo, Janet Morana, Georgette Forney, Bishop David Choby of the Diocese of Nashville, TN, Dr. Peter Kleponis, Dr. Cindy Dillard, Msgr. Mike Mannion, Guido & Susan Fetta, Msgr. Mike Magee, and many more.

This year's conference theme was *Disciples of Love, Witnesses of Hope*. Unlike past leadership conferences, Rachel's Vineyard and the Silent No More Awareness Campaign collaborated to offer a specific Silent No More Learning Track. This track offered Silent No More regional coordinators specific training on things such as healing workshops, media, public speaking, and more! Another unique feature of this year's conference was an optional day trip to the Pennsylvania Amish country for a tour of a Jewish temple replica and the production of "*The Story of Joseph*" at the Site and Sound Theater. Since 1999 Thersea and Kevin Burke, founders of Rachel's Vineyard, have hosted similar Rachel's Vineyard Conferences in countries such as Canada, Australia, New Zealand, England, Ireland and the United States.

Rachel's Vineyard Branches Out to Lebanon

Rachel's Vineyard continues to grow as the largest post-abortion healing ministry in the world thanks to the countless efforts of the many RV site leaders from around the globe. Most recently, the vineyard has branched out to the post-abortive men and women in Lebanon with the help of Bernadette Goulding, site leader for Rachel's Vineyard in Ireland.

Though abortion is illegal in Lebanon, it is still practiced under various names in hospitals throughout the country. Goulding states, "Many choose to believe their doctors who say that the unborn baby is just a bunch of cells and it seems that women in general are uninformed about the gravity of abortion as well as its consequences. More education is needed." Pregnancy outside of marriage is very much looked down upon in Lebanon and single mothers are not often seen in public. Therefore, abortion is looked at as a way to "alleviate the problem" and to uphold the family's reputation. In addition, Lebanese women are not able to pass on their nationality to their children. This means that if the father of a child disowns them by means of not wanting them, the child has no nationality. Goulding remarks, "Abortions are kept secret and private."

It was by God's divine intervention that Goulding was given this opportunity for healing in the Lebanese community. Though she was originally invited to Lebanon by a woman who heard her speak at a Charismatic conference in Co. Mayo, Ireland about a year went by with no success in organizing a retreat. The woman then began asking her prayer group to pray that God would intervene for this important cause. Not long after, Bernadette received a call from a Lebanese Friar of the Renewal who asked her to come give her testimony and speak about Rachel's Vineyard and the effects of abortion. From there, a retreat was finally organized.

Goulding states that she felt comfortable among the retreatants, despite a slight language barrier. "I found the Lebanese people to be very pleasant and warm, and felt very much at home there."

The retreat was an overall success for all who attended. Retreatants had comments such as:

"Since the retreat my relationship with my mother has been healed.....my mother told me for the first time that she loves me.... she never said that to me before....I can now say that I love my mother with all my heart."

"Since the RV retreat, my sister phoned me to say that she loves me and forgives me and my wife for the hurt we caused her in the past and she asked for forgiveness for the hurt that she caused us. I now have a new relationship with my sister."

"I work on the relationship with my unborn daughter every day and now I feel she is more a part of my family."

The retreat even resulted in a miraculous healing! Goulding reports, "On the yahoo groups this week there was stuff about the living scriptures. One of the retreatants had breathing problems, and on examination, the doctor could hear a 'whispering' in his lungs. He has been on medication for many years in the form of a spray. During the Living Scripture 'unbinding of Lazarus' he felt a big relief in his lungs and he could take a deep breath, something he had not been able to do for many years. Since the retreat, he is off medication and his symptoms have not returned. Praise God!"

Thank you, Bernadette, for all of your hard work in spreading the healing work of the Vineyard! Let us pray for the fruitful efforts of the Vineyard in Lebanon and around the world.

Night Vision Music Festival

I was recently at the Night Vision Music Festival in Colorado. I had the amazing opportunity to address 25,000 people (mostly a younger audience) during the Night Vision Festival and share about the work that all of you are doing in Rachel's Vineyard. I was invited by Victoria Hearst, sister to Patty Hearst. She loves Rachel's Vineyard!

I have never spoken before to so many people and I was so nervous. There was an amazing Salsa band playing a set before my talk. "El Trio de Hoy" check em out. So I closed my eyes and started praying and dancing up on stage in the wings behind all the sound equipment. I had a great workout and thankfully all my nerves left me.

Victoria began her introduction of me with quotations from Mother Teresa! You could have heard a pin drop and people were very attentive. Then I spoke about Rachel's Vineyard. The winds suddenly started and it began to spritz - I was warned they might have to shut down till the storm passed - but it quickly stopped. Then I said: Lord, if it's not too much trouble, can you give me a rainbow??? And He did just that as a rainbow appeared!

The next day, the concerts continued and Dr. Alveda King and Father Frank Pavone addressed the issue of abortion. They were both outstanding! Alveda showed some clips about black genocide and told the story of her abortions. Most were hearing this message for the first time as a pro-life message is not really spoken much in these churches and among the thousands of young people present. I was rocking out to Vanessa Mitchell's soulful Gospel music and a song about Unity. A beautiful singer sang The Silent No More Theme song.

I sat on the plane with an evangelical Bishop, and another pastor who is the Chairman of the Board of a hospital which is only 10 minutes from where I live. He wants to offer Rachel's Vineyard in that hospital!

We met in numerous groups with scores of pastors and leaders from various ministries, so I do anticipate a good upsurge of interdenominational retreats getting started.

After all the stress of the past month, Night Vision Music Festival was truly a blessed event! I can't even begin to tell you how much fun I had - it was an incredible time of intimacy with Jesus! I felt Him very close to me as I enjoyed the beautiful Christian bands all day Saturday and then He topped the night off with my favorite: fireworks! Then, as if to make His presence and authority completely unmistakable - the mighty voice of his thunder and the breathtaking energy of his lightning!!! I feel so privileged to have had the opportunity to share the healing work of Rachel's Vineyard and so many people came up to me to disclose past abortions of themselves or a son, sister or daughter. It was great to refer them to upcoming retreats.

Some of the Christian music groups who participated included Mercy Me, Surprise Guest T-Bone; Travis Green, Sanctus Real, Superchick, Casting Crowns and many more. It's very likely we will go again next year, so you might want to come camp out in the Rockies next summer for a few days. I saw friends from Rachel's Vineyard team from Farmington, NM. I can't wait to see them again at the upcoming clinical training in Farmington next year.

Rachel's Vineyard Establishes Medical Board

The biannual training conference for the world's largest ministry of healing after abortion, Rachel's Vineyard, continued in Malvern, Pa., Wednesday with the formal establishment of a Medical Advisory Board.

Rachel's Vineyard utilizes the services of psychiatrists, psychologists, therapists and other professionals in the mental health field throughout the world. They assist both on the retreats and in the development and analysis of the effectiveness of this treatment model.

The establishment of a special advisory board now formalizes what has been happening all along, but brings the added advantage of being able to present to the medical and therapeutic community a more structured method of communicating about the issues of trauma and healing after abortion.
