Picture yourself planning a weekend away. You search for the perfect hotel for you and your family. Naturally, you look for pictures and descriptions of the facilities. Do they have a pool? How big are the rooms etc.?

Now place yourself in the shoes of a post-abortive man or woman looking to go away for the weekend to attend a Rachel's Vineyard retreat. You're scared, nervous, and apprehensive. You finally click on a retreat site and the first thing you see are the smiling faces of the retreat team. You scroll down to view a beautiful retreat location then you breathe a sigh of relief. Seeing these welcoming pictures and reading a personal note from the site leader put your mind a little more at ease and allow you to pick up the phone and call.

This is the vision of our new retreat site layout on our website. We now offer an opportunity for retreat sites to post pictures of their team, site leader and retreat facilities. They can also provide a welcome note and more specific information about their retreat. This will allow potential retreatants to feel more comfortable calling someone because they have a face to put with a name and number. Healing a Younger Generation

We recently had the opportunity to sit down with Bryan Kemper. Bryan is now the Director of Youth Outreach for Priests for Life.

How do you see Rachel's Vineyard and The Youth Outreach of Priests for Life interfacing in the future?

I see several ways. The traditional way is obviously as we go out and we do outreach at abortion centers there is always going to be the woman and man who need healing afterward. It is the same with almost any ministry which interacts with Rachel's Vineyard. You have to have that hope and forgiveness aspect to present to people after abortion. I would go as far as saying doing any kind of prolife work without a connection with Rachel's Vineyard is unwise. It has to be well rounded outreach. One of the unique things with youth pro-life is that we are now dealing with young people who

are finding out that they lost a sibling to abortion (these siblings are welcome at Rachel's Vineyard retreats.) We are starting to see this new pain and this new hurt. By working together with Rachel's Vineyard we can really develop and meet the needs of these young people. This is a unique partnership that we can also provide to other pro-life youth outreaches. I can't tell you how many kids tell me that they bought a pro-life t-shirt from me and that is what triggered their mother to finally break down and share that they had an abortion.

In your travels/work have you seen an increase in post-abortive teens?

Yes. One sticks out with me. I remember this last summer I spent a few hours with a young lady she came to our booth and looked at fetal models for a while with her mom and then she walked away. Her mom explained that she had an abortion a few months before. I think that maybe 20-30 years ago it was really "easy" for a woman to admit her regret for an abortion. But these days because of Planned Parenthood etc saying that Post Abortion Syndrome doesn't exist, these women/girls are hurting and feel guilty that they are experiencing those feelings. With young women it is so much harder for her to come to grips with the trauma. Society has tried to make them bury it. When a young woman breaks down sometimes it is harder to help her because she is living in a society that is telling her that she needs to be tough. You see these websites of women bragging about their abortions-there are t-shirts that even say-"I've had an abortion." That to me is so anti-feminist. They are taught that they aren't allowed to regret it or else they are weak. The weakest person is the person who can't admit when they've made a mistake.

Have you ever referred a young person to a Rachel's Vineyard retreat before?

Have you ever eaten ice cream? Haha, yes, I constantly refer young women to Rachel's Vineyard. In fact there is a young pastor in my town who is even writing his thesis on Post-Abortion Syndrome and I keep throwing in Rachel's Vineyard stuff for him to use.

Why do you think we are seeing more post-abortive young people?

Abortion is being pushed on our youth. They are targeted for a vicious cycle by organizations like Planned Parenthood. They are teaching them at a preteen age about sex, how to be sexually active. They give them a false safety net with contraception. When that fails, give them an abortion and start them on the next "cycle." It is turning young people into adults at an early age. Kids aren't allowed to be kids anymore. One of the biggest blessings in my life is that my daughter who is about to be 13 in May, still says "boys are gross." She's still being a kid. There is no reason for us to be over-sexualizing these kids. In Ohio a few years back Planned Parenthood was recruiting high school kids, and for every person they referred to PP for contraception etc., they got \$5.

Do you have any closing thoughts?

I think that one thing that I want to see is Rachel's Vineyard and ministries like Rachel's Vineyard (other post-abortion healing organizations) become as important and as promoted as Crisis Pregnancy Centers. Crisis Pregnancy Centers are so important but we also have to be there with the Rachel's Vineyard stuff for after. You can find 100

people to go to the abortion clinic and sidewalk counsel but maybe only 1 to stay there after when then men and women get out. I want to see the same kind of zeal for Rachel's Vineyard that I see in the prolife movement for Crisis Pregnancy Centers.
