

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Time to Remember is September...Starting the New Year by. Dr. Theresa Burke, Founder Rachel's Vineyard Ministries

The fall always marks the beginning of a new year for me. My wedding anniversary is August 31... the last day of summer and certainly marked a huge transition from being single and fancy-free into a lifetime of commitment, responsibilities, and promises. As the mother of five incredible children, our resolutions typically occur over Labor Day in anticipation of the first day of school.

Because I have been struggling with health issues and physical disability since I broke my foot at the 2011 July Leadership Conference and shortly afterwards developed a systemic relapse into RSD (Reflexive Sympathetic Dystrophy) I had been on a medical leave for the past year! Though I struggled to accept the new "normal" which revolved around doctors appointments and life in a wheelchair, I am happy to report that after surgery, many long hours of physiotherapy and rehabilitation, I am doing very well and am ready to begin again the work that God has set out for me to do.

The Lord has always and will continue to provide... but that does not mean that it has always been an easy road. At times our family has made sacrifices, been "tested," as have those who work to spread the ministry. But all good works end up on the cross and without the cross there is no resurrection. This is our faith.

This past year was a challenge to say the least! My sister Katie, the superwoman behind the scenes at Rachel's Vineyard was working endlessly managing the office, working on revisions for the Interdenominational Retreat, and coping with the caretaking responsibilities of our beloved mother. My mom had a similar year with illnesses, trips, flips, falls and surgeries. My husband Kevin lost his mother after many years of suffering and tried to keep Rachel's Vineyard going despite everything that was going on around us. We did the best we could and made it through.

Today, I can rightfully say Happy New Year!!! I always buy a calendar that begins in September (not January) and it generally takes me hours to write all the kids school activities down in advance. As a working mom who travels extensively, I hated to miss important events in my children's lives. I get excited just thinking about some of this year's upcoming shows and concerts, and how much I will enjoy them!!! My children have always been my greatest treasure and each child is exceptionally gifted, talented and very involved! My faith, my marriage and my family has always been my "real life."

After that, I am Dr. Theresa Burke... so the next calendar planning included all the commitments I had with Rachel's Vineyard and Priests for Life: from the International Leadership Conferences, to writing new treatment models, to my private practice and everything in between. Then, last but certainly not least my calendar is filled with bike rides, kayaking adventures, and ski trips! I typically write a list of my goals for the year and I simply love to check off each item as it is accomplished. God helps to multiply the hours in my days sort of like Jesus multiplied the loaves and fishes for the crowds, sending special angels to help me just when they are needed most.

It's not easy to maintain positive vision in all circumstances especially when we are invited to constantly revise our plans and dreams because of reality. Life brings change

–stuff that simply was not on our calendar of activities! Consequently, we need to challenge our ideas that the predictable past must never change. We have to risk and trust so that we can keep growing – but change is hard. As humans we don't like change and this past year, I had very little change to spare, like the rest of my good friends unemployed, or fighting cancer and other diseases. Even so, we all crave and demand the familiar, even when it's not good for us anymore. We have to let our old selves die, so that we can embrace the present moment and dream into the future with hope. Our work is about Jesus Christ – and the gift of salvation. We see clearly today, as we observe in the Bible, the extraordinary effort that some political leaders and Pharisees go to in order to stop efforts to evangelize. Jesus Christ was a threat to the establishment – he invited the world to REPENT. Repent simply means change. Pray for those who persecute you, love your enemies, seek justice for the poor in spirit, comfort those who mourn – The Kingdom of God is among us and He is doing tremendous miracles for those who believe!

All preaching aside, the New Year for me means saying “**good riddance**” to the past year of trials and suffering and to welcome the vibrant hope and promise that Christ “makes all things new.” As they say, “it’s always darkest before the dawn.” Well the sun is beginning to rise!

This past year I have been in the unusual role to be on the receiving end of love and support from more ministry friends than I can count. I am grateful that so many of you have truly been there for me. I have also been on the receiving end of extraordinary pain. In the New Year, I offer my love, acceptance, forgiveness and prayers for the unique needs, sufferings, hurts and burdens that we all carry.... And express my joy and gratitude for the gift of family, and the gift of so many beautiful ministries where God's blessing flows with such tenderness and power. In addition, I'll continue to work as hard as I can to continue in my recovery from physical illness. Taking care of ourselves, getting enough sleep, and protecting our health can be the greatest gift we can give to those whom we love and serve.

I pray that the dignity of the human person will be upheld in governments throughout our troubled earth. Our peace must begin in our hearts, in our families and then we can extend that to the world in our ministries.

Humanity is truly suffering right now – and there is a tremendous need for all men of good will to hear the good news! Come Lord Jesus; grant us peace, reconciliation, love, and a calm and steady trust in your power to save us. The work of Rachel's Vineyard is a work of Christ -- we have always known it is his grace and effort - not a divine light born from our own feeble efforts.

I have learned that the scripture passage is illuminating and real: In my weakness, I have found a great strength! I am grateful for all the lessons I have learned, for the gift of healing, and for all the ways I know God will use everything I learned to help others!

I remember pulling away from my apartment in Pennsylvania for the last time in August of 2009. I was still coming down from the high of an incredibly successful Rachel's Vineyard Conference and could barely believe I was about to embark on a journey across the entire country to my new home in Los Angeles. Even then, as I pulled my enormous Grand Marquis into the street I somehow knew that my days with Rachel's Vineyard weren't over. This time around I'd like to leave another kind of impression; this time I'd like to delve even more deeply into the mission of this ministry, extending my hand and heart to anyone in search of healing...although dressing up like farm animals is certainly not off the table.

The Will to WIN

If you knock enough times, someone will eventually open the door, right? But what if your patience and persistence are wearing thin and you quit without knowing if the next tap produced the sound that summoned the person on the other side? When do we ever know if enough is enough and it is time for a change?

Consider the story of Florence Mae Chadwick. Florence was born in 1918 in San Diego and developed a special knack for swimming at an early age. Even though she would go down as one of the greatest female endurance swimmers in American history, for some reason she could not master the short pool swims. In 1936, she tried out for the Olympics but failed to qualify because the distances were too short. Realizing her weakness, she decided to focus on her strength. How much more could you do in your own life if your focus was to make your strengths stronger and not put so much attention

on where you are weak. The sad fact is most people in our circle of influence sure help to magnify the areas we lack instead of shining light on where we excel.

Fast forward to July 4, 1952. Florence was going to become the first female swimmer to cross from Catalina Island to Palos Verde, CA. It was a nice day by California standards, yet the water as usual was ice cold. Florence set out mentally and physically prepared for the feat. After 15 hours and 55 minutes, the fog was so dense she asked to be taken out of the water. To her surprise when the fog lifted, she was less than a half mile from her goal.

One more push, just a few more strokes and a little more resolve and she would have made history that day, but as she would later say she gave up too quickly. As fate would have it, 2 months later Florence set out one more time to accomplish her seemingly impossible task. Even though the fog came along just as dense as before, she persevered that day and finished in less than 14 hours. She would tell everyone that the only difference was her willingness to go where she could not see and have faith that provided her enough strength to make it.

How often in life do you set out with high hopes and expectations yet you quit your pursuit only to find out you were so close to your goal? I always think about the soldiers at the foot of the cross that windy day on Calvary when Jesus hung there waiting for his ascension to glory. Those men were so close to the cross, yet so far from Christ. They mocked and laughed at him only to find out later how close to salvation they truly were.

Life is all about going around one more turn, saying yes one more time, opening one more door, or looking out another window. It is sad to see the ones that quit too soon and sink like the Titanic with their treasure still in them. The good news is that it does not have to be that way. Regardless of where you are or what you have, if you have a breath in you there is still hope for grand things to happen. Dreams are not made by those who walk away - oh no, it is the man who believes that achieves and in him shall he conceive the greatness and the will to receive. It is hope that makes the difference so let's all pull together in true hippie style and make the world a better place. I will go the extra mile and push you to do the same.
