

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## **People Want to Know That Their Suffering Has Meaning Fr. Jeffrey Stephaniuk**

Dr. Theresa Burke, founder of Rachel's Vineyard Ministries, spoke at an event organized by the Christian Medical/Dental Society in Saskatoon, Canada on Thursday, April 25 at the Nutana Park Mennonite Church. She taught about abortions traumatic effects including the psychological impact of chemical abortions, which turn every mother into an abortionist and every bathroom into an abortion clinic.

"Crash Course in Trauma" was the name of Dr. Burke's presentation. She spent a considerable amount of time describing the undisputed characteristics of trauma, the world of hyper-arousal, intrusion, and constriction familiar to combat veterans and civilians who have witnessed

profound life-threatening experiences; her purpose being to situate abortion firmly as an experience of trauma. "PTSD is a psychological disorder which results from a traumatic experience that overwhelms a person's normal defense mechanisms." Experiences of flashbacks, for example, are not psychotic reactions caused by medication, but are directly linked to losing a child through abortion." Trauma keeps the person locked in a conflict or reenactment, always involving post-traumatic repetition," including repeat abortions, the hope is that "this time I'll do it right."

The reason for applying trauma principles to spiritual and psychological healing often abortion is that abortion can then be acknowledged as a source of trauma. The methods of healing abortion grief such as a Rachel's Vineyard retreat, are much more effective than psychotropic drugs, which only compound the already high inclination toward suicide and risk taking behavior following abortion itself. The experience of fear and panic following an abortion leads to the confusing diagnosis that "there is nothing wrong with you physically" until the connection is made between the anxiety and the abortion. "Resolve the grief, reconcile with yourself and the aborted child, and sleep without medication," she explained, stating that sleep deprivation is linked to 72 illnesses. "Rachel's Vineyard gives those who suffer permission to grieve and no longer dehumanize their baby, because when you shut down one part of your heart, there can be a domino effect on your physical and mental health."

Questions from the audience indicated that Dr. Burke made a significant impression. One listener was surprised that there is no difference in grief and trauma if an abortion is executed early in the first trimester, second trimester, or late in the third trimester. In each instance, "this is a death event" no matter how counter-intuitive or counter-cultural it is to suggest that an early abortion, when the embryo does not look like a child, is equivalent in grief to any other abortion.

Dr. Burke also made several connections between abortion and health consequences in subsequent "wanted" pregnancies. She spoke of the anxiety that leads to the abuse of alcohol during pregnancy, fear of losing the child, or thinking that some harm might come to the child. The experience of "not wanting to let it go" means that at delivery, c-sections can be required. "Obsessions with the next pregnancy, anxiety and the release of trauma chemistry shared with the baby can lead to the development of an immature nervous system." Intense anxiety at being in a medical environment again, this time for delivery can be triggering

for the women. The sights and sounds and smells connect her to the experience of abortion, which can translate into difficulties bonding with the new child. "The high anxiety can make it difficult to relax enough to allow lactation or a "let down" of milk to begin." Of particular interest for Dr. Burke, "Something I hope to contribute to the literature on," is the connection between autism and high anxiety. "Autism cannot be screened for but perhaps we could screen for higher testosterone levels, caused by anger and stress during pregnancy which is connected to autism. Greater amounts of Testosterone would be produced by angry, stressed mothers." Her solution is to undertake the work of healing from a past abortion before another baby is born.

One connection I made from the presentation is that there is a sinister aspect to the bureaucracy of scheduling abortions. Young mothers are being pressured to make abortion and ultrasound appointments by being assured that they can always cancel the appointments later. Such a conflicted beginning to the relationship with one's pre-born child adds to stress and ambiguous bonding. Pre-natal testing for genetic abnormalities similarly confuses the natural work of bonding. In addition, the use of such information following an abortion for the purpose of informing other family members about the risk of imperfect babies puts a lie to the abortion ideology that a woman's private medical treatment must not be used for other purposes. While geneticists have license to share such information without an outcry of breach of privacy, there is an embargo, for example, of information about the abortionist Gosnell murder trial in Philadelphia because such information would exploit women's private medical experience.

An insightful summary to the evening came from one of the audience members, who stated a quote from author Parker Palmer, "Whenever we don't know what to do with suffering, violence is the result." Dr. Burke has a similar line in her manual on Rachel's Vineyard, namely that "people want to know that their suffering has meaning." The contrast is stark: doctors and medical professors traumatized by their own involvement with abortion feel compelled to the point of obsession to promote abortion. While Dr. Burke seeks to liberate individuals from these traumatic reenactments, and replace destructive ways of memorializing one's aborted child with healthy remembrances and a new-found freedom in their own lives.

## **Brief of Women and Families Hurt by RU-486 As Amici Curiae in Support of Petitioners**

### **A summary**

Dr. Theresa Burke was asked to help attorney, Linda Boston Schlueter solidify the appeal she was drafting known as: Brief of Women and Families Hurt by RU-486 As Amici Curiae in Support of Petitioners. Linda was filing an appeal to the Supreme Court of Oklahoma's ruling in the case Oklahoma Coalition for Reproductive Justice v. Terry Cline which took place in 2011. She was trying to prove that the Supreme Court of Oklahoma misused the case of Planned Parenthood v. Casey when deciding that House Bill 1970 was unconstitutional.

House Bill 1970 stated that doctors could not prescribe or give "off-label" abortifacients to their patients or clients. The reason for this is that these abortifacients have not and may never be tested by the FDA to see what the potential risk factors might be and will therefore not have accurate side effects printed on the package. The Supreme Court of Oklahoma decided that House Bill 1970 made it harder for women to procure abortifacients. They cited Planned Parenthood v. Casey in which the ruling in favor of Casey illustrates that, "The State Has the Right to Provide Reasonable Regulations for the Health and Safety of Women." Linda believes that the Oklahoma Supreme Court erred when ruling that the Oklahoma House Bill 1970 was unconstitutional.

Linda contacted Dr. Burke on the advice of Dr. Martha Shuping, asking for assistance in making a case in regard to use of "off-label" abortifacients, abortion inducing drugs. She had the facts about how and why abortifacients were harmful to women but she needed the stories and explanation of emotional trauma from those who had firsthand experience with abortifacients including what they had been told the potential side effects of using the product might be. Dr. Burke had presented a workshop entitled Expanding Abortion: Medical abortion - New Emotional & Psychological Landscape, at our last Rachel's Vineyard Leader Conference and we opened Linda's request for testimonies to our E groups for Rachel's Vineyard Leaders and Alumni.

What she was able to compile was a well written brief which included statements made by the Food and Drug Administration with some of their findings regarding the RU-486 drug as well as statistics including the

number of women who have died or were seriously injured due to the use of this drug.

However, the most compelling evidence she brought forth in the brief were the affidavits from women who used an abortifacient in order to have what is commonly referred to as a "medical abortion." Many women choose to have a medical abortion because they are told that it is safest way to have an abortion. In reality, studies conducted by the FDA found that, "in the USA among a group of 2,207" cases of medical abortion there were reported, "adverse events such as, 14 deaths, 612 hospitalizations, 339 blood transfusions, and 256 infections (including 48 serious infections)."

She included five affidavits. Three were personal testimonies from women who have undergone a medical abortion. Another was from a woman who owned a chain of abortion clinics but did not realize the horrible reality of what happened to women who chose a medical abortion until she herself opted to have one. The last affidavit she included may have been the most compelling; it is the affidavit from the father of Holly Patterson, the first woman in the USA to die after undergoing a medical abortion.

In each of the affidavits the person states that they were not told what the serious side effects might include. They were not shown the findings of the FDA nor were they given any documentation that stated that the drug they were given was not approved by the FDA. They were all told of minor side effects such as menstrual like symptoms but nothing more serious. The affidavits corroborate the trend of the FDA findings. The aforementioned adverse events were the norm and not the exception.

The FDA found that in their study "27% had ongoing pregnancies, 43% had incomplete abortions, 10% requested and had surgical terminations, and the remaining 20% had surgical terminations performed because of medical circumstances directly related to the medical procedure." This is another fact that is not explained to women who may be opting to have a medical abortion. The FDA also found that there is an "incredibly high failure rate of the drug." The FDA learned that through a 63 day gestational period there was a failure rate of 14.6% in the US trial testing.

Linda found that abortion clinics would rather have a women undergo a medical abortion because it is a quicker means of abortion for the clinic. However, medical abortions for the women who are having them take days not to mention the amount of pain and suffering they endured due

to the side effects. For the Supreme Court of Oklahoma to use the findings in Planned Parenthood v. Casey to say that abortionists now have the right to prescribe "off-label" abortifacients to unsuspecting women is a criminal offense.

This little article barely illustrates the need for House Bill 1970 of Oklahoma to be reinstated. It is also important for the FDA to recognize their role in this very important matter. Please pray for the Supreme Court to rule in favor of reinstating House Bill 1970. It would be a step, albeit a small one, in the right direction to have abortion made illegal and the rights of women to be upheld.

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## **A Call to Action: Why the Gosnell Trial should Ring the Alarm for Activists**

Kermit Gosnell should be a household name. His story should be all over the news...but it's not.

In case you've never heard the name, Kermit Gosnell is the abortionist based out of Philadelphia who's charged with seven counts of murder, including babies born alive during illegal late term abortions. The grisly Grand Jury report included descriptions of the nightmarish conditions inside the facility: blood-stained recliners, cat feces on the floor, and the remains of tiny babies left all over the facility.

latest updates on the trial; seek out the information and share it with others.
