Abortion: What if We Started to Listen?

I came out of the abortion closet in 2008 and I sometimes deal with religious Pro-Lifers who consider that I have committed the unforgivable sin and who lecture me about the past (you were selfish, you should have kept your legs closed etc...).

I also deal with secular Pro-Choicers telling me I'm Pro-Life because I'm a "religious fanatic who wants to take away women's rights and control their bodies."

-Twitter conversation about reaching out to women who had an abortion:

Me: "Women need hope and healing after abortion #RachelsVineyardRetreat".

Pro-Life user: "They need not to have abortions to begin with. Try abstinence"

Me: "I can't go back in time and undo the past. I can learn from my mistakes and help others."

Pro-Life user: "That's not a mistake, that's a choice. Sorry choices have consequences."

-Secular Pro-Choicer about my support of a Pro-Life bill on Facebook:

"You cannot force me to give a kidney to my living child and you cannot force me to bring one to term. I'm not a vessel for your religious commitments. Full stop. I have rights which you cannot take away."

Same Pro-Choicer, commenting on my essay about the satanic aspects of abortion (in which I indicate that I experienced Satan's presence as an

atheist): "Oh you ARE a fundamentalist who believes in supernatural things... that helps clarify your position."

Do these people actually listen to women's stories? Maybe they don't have time to read and listen because in this age, everything has to go fast and conform to one's culture and preconceived ideas.

It's too bad they don't see the women among us who struggle, who are not "reproductive rights" activists but had an abortion and need to know that they are not alone and that help is available.

Not everybody was raised with Conservative values or high moral standards and no one can change the past. We can only meet people where they are at, both those considering abortion and those who had abortions. Focusing on a person's sins with a lack of empathy can discourage post-abortive women from seeking help and move them to rationalize their abortion and live in denial.

Jesus forgives and heals. However, there are always dates, sounds, smells and places that may trigger memories and symptoms. Three years ago, I had a mental break down as the 10th anniversary of my second abortion was approaching. The 20th anniversary of my first abortion is coming in January. Honestly, I don't know how I will feel at that time but I know I have friends who will pray for me.

Abortion doesn't end when we leave the clinic, it stays with us always and healing is a long process. It's hard but it's liberating to not lie to ourselves anymore. Abortion recovery programs help us to remember our abortion with less pain (in the words of a counselor on my Rachel's Vineyard Retreat), but we can never forget.

As an atheist, I knew that abortion is humiliating, traumatizing, that it benefits immature men who use it against us. I had a conversion to the Catholic faith in recent years, but in the past, I admitted that abortion was evil; only, I was repeating to myself, "it's a necessary evil," to justify my abortions and to not completely lose my mind. But now I'm not afraid to say that abortion is an unnecessary evil. I named my aborted children Alicia and Gabriel and I was able to say goodbye and grieve, but nothing could bring them back.

Despite the mean comments and straw man arguments, I will continue to be a Pro-Life advocate because what is important is the pregnant woman who needs information, support and alternatives to abortion. What is important is the post-abortive woman locked in her bathroom right now, crying and considering suicide. What these women need is not condemnation, not somebody defending a political "right to choose". What they need is hope and love, not judgment and indifference.

Fruits of the Vineyard:

- One Woman's Journey From Tragedy and Loss to Healing and Hope

[EDITOR'S NOTE: Names and some locations have been changed for this story.]

The Group was asked to go to the center of the room and each pick up a small stone. They would carry this for the rest of the Rachel's Vineyard retreat.

They sit in a circle in a soft-lit room, with the stones under a coffee table at the center. Soothing music plays lightly in the background of what feels like a cozy living room. It is a space that has an air of non-confrontation, beckoning retreatants to relax and know they can share their stories in confidence.

Participants were quickly disarmed at the start by reflecting on the story of Jesus saving the adulteress from stoning (Jn 8:1-11). The small stones represent their burdens in life. They then turn to the person next to them and ask, "Has anyone here condemned you? Then neither do I condemn you." They eventually let go of the stone.

Deborah is now a volunteer at these retreats. She helps with setup, food

preparation and whatever else is needed behind the scenes. Deborah has felt the powerful healing that comes from these retreats, that deeper reconnection with God as an unconditional lover.

She likens the beginning of a Rachel's Vineyard retreat to the same fears one has going into the confessional, "only now you are opening yourself up to a group of people." Participants begin to share their burdens — often for the first time — and nobody is allowed to interject. There is no condemnation or judgment; everyone is on a level playing field. Rachel's Vineyard retreats are offered as safe havens for participants to "renew, rebuild and redeem hearts broken by abortion."

Throughout the retreat, they listen, they share, they cry, they question . . . and they heal. Near the end of the retreat, participants are asked to name the baby they aborted. For Deborah, this was one of the most healing parts of her Rachel's Vineyard experience.

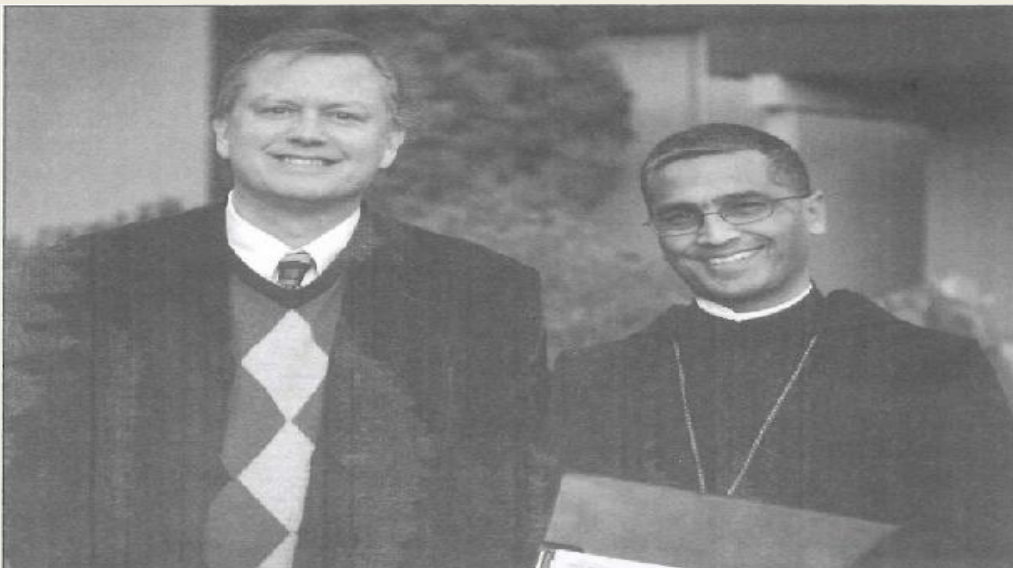
"Before going to the event, I recognized it was by the grace of God's mercy and love that I had been forgiven. Everything I was reading and feeling . . . it all came back to God's grace. It was clear to me that the baby's name was Grace," she said.

At home, a little piece of jewelry Deborah prizes has a heart with two wings and a star. It reminds her of Grace. "She is lifting my heart to God."

Overview of the Seminary of Christ the King Lecture given by Kevin Burke in Mission, B.C. Canada

After flying out from Philadelphia, Kevin Burke - the co-founder of Rachel's Vineyard Ministries - came up to the Abbey to speak at the annual SCK lecture this past November 23rd. As a seasoned social worker and writer, Kevin succinctly articulated the phenomenon of post-abortion trauma. He zeroed-in especially on the countless wounded men who were complicit in abortion decisions and - years after - are still reeling from the compounding effects of pregnancy loss. Kevin presented the hard facts and explained how the haunting outcomes of these regrettable actions (i.e. unresolved grief and shame leading to anger, resentment, and despair) do not disappear after a month or two nor are the consequences felt by the mother alone. Rather, the whole family and, indeed, the whole culture becomes increasingly lacerated by the willful severing of natural relational bonds and by the dismissive attitude toward the need for reparation.

Grounded in his Catholic faith and speaking with warm conviction, Kevin also shared many fascinating aspects of his and his wife Theresa's growing ministry of hope and healing. Tackling trauma one weekend at a time, Rachel's Vineyard has had a remarkable impact. Over the course of three days, by engaging the bodies, minds, emotions, and souls of women and men suffering from this trauma, the Rachel's Vineyard retreat team (including a priest) is able to open their wounded sisters and brothers up to the transformative power of grace. The healing process certainly does not end after the final session, but when one looks at the consistent trend of their guests being guided from the road of repression to the path of acknowledgement, hope, and love, it is strikingly obvious that the Rachel's Vineyard program is a proven recipe for success.

Their inaugural retreat dates back to 1995 and, since then, Theresa and Kevin's ministry - affirmed by Pope Francis - has spread like holy wildfire across the globe. Last year their international team held over one thousand Rachel's Vineyard programs and no one expects this escalating trend of support to discontinue. Deo gratias!
