Jesus, Teach us to Imitate Your Mercy

The Most Rev. Samuel J. Aquila is the eighth bishop of Denver and its fifth archbishop. His episcopal motto is, "Do whatever he tells you" (Jn 2:5).

Last week I met two amazing women dedicated to healing the broken. They were from Rachel's Vineyard, an apostolate that holds retreats for men and women who have experienced the tragic consequences of choosing abortion.

During our meeting I heard something that surprised me. I learned that sometimes people in parishes question the need for retreats for those who have aborted their children. The fact that these retreats are being questioned is revealing.

It shows that some people have failed to grasp the power and depth of God's mercy, which is able to wipe away every sin. Abortion is undeniably a grave sin, but it is by no means a sin beyond God's mercy.

It also demonstrates that it is not widely known that abortion not only takes an innocent life but also inflicts deep wounds on the mother and father. Christ longs to forgive and heal those who have sinned, no matter what the sin, and he desires to do so through his Church.

Benedict XVI reflected on this truth in a 2008 address to priests on the importance of the sacrament of confession in our day. To illustrate his point, he recalled the passage from Luke's Gospel (7:36-50) in which a well-known prostitute walks into the house of Simon the Pharisee, while he is hosting Jesus for dinner.

The sinful woman expressed her repentance by bathing

Jesus' feet with her tears, drying them with her hair and anointing them with oil. In contrast, Simon presumed that he was righteous and that he had nothing serious to be forgiven for.

Then-Pope Benedict explained, the "message that shines out from this Gospel passage is eloquent: God forgives all to those who love much. Those who trust in themselves and in their own merits are ... blinded by their ego and their heart is hardened in sin."

One dad who attended a Rachel's Vineyard retreat also spoke about how he was transformed by the weekend. "I never realized what a need there was in my life for this healing. I needed to consider that men need to heal also."

In her diary "Divine Mercy in My Soul," St. Faustina Kowalska recounted a conversation she had with Christ that beautifully describes his willingness to forgive and heal the broken.

Jesus told St. Faustina: "Let the greatest sinners place their trust in my mercy. They have the right before others to trust in the abyss of my mercy. My daughter, write about my mercy toward tormented souls. Souls that make an appeal to my mercy delight me. To such souls I grant even more graces than asked. I cannot punish even the greatest sinner if he makes an appeal to my compassion, but on the contrary, I justify him in my unfathomable and inscrutable mercy."

This is a truth that can change our lives, our parishes and our world. Let us not stand in the way of God's mercy, but open the doors to it! Let us bring sinners to Jesus Christ and his Church and not judge them harshly.

I pray that Rachel's Vineyard will spread throughout our archdiocese, bringing healing to all those who have been wounded by abortion and new life in Christ to those who are far from him. I pray too for those who want to limit the mercy of Jesus by their harshness toward women who have had abortions. May all of us receive in our hearts the "unfathomable and inscrutable mercy" of Jesus and proclaim it to a world that so desperately needs it!

Lifelong Effects of Abortion on Men – A Robbed Manhood...

Little attention is given to men when the topic of abortion is raised. Many believe since men don't have a uterus they don't have the right to an opinion on the matter. But a pregnancy doesn't involve just the pregnant woman. Many people are involved – a child yet born, future and/or existing siblings, grandparents, and yes, a father.

Not only does abortion hurt women, it ruins the lives of men as well. It robs them of the fatherhood and effects the way they see themselves as a man.

Let me introduce my friend R. We met about 3 years ago at a Rachel's Vineyard retreat. He allowed me to share his story.

R. admitted how profoundly he'd been changed after an abortion his girlfriend, now ex-wife, underwent when they were teenagers. They both felt crushing parental pressure to have an abortion. As scared teenagers they went to their parents for help. Instead they got sermons and statistics thrown at them.

"Young parents have a lower success rate of finishing college. The odds were insurmountable. It would be cruel to bring an unwanted baby into the world that would just burden everyone. Think of the cost. Think of the delayed or abandoned plans and dream. Abortion is the best thing," they rationalized.

R. shared with us how he and his girlfriend never wanted to end the pregnancy but neither had the courage to stand up against their parents, who they trusted to know better.

He vividly recalled his ex-wife, then a terrified 18 year old girl, staring at him with desperate pleading eyes. She wanted him to stand up and firmly say "This is my child too. You will not have an abortion. We can cope."

Instead he looked away.

The decision was made by their parents and the following week they drove her to the clinic. It was done.

They eventually got married and had several more children together but from the moment he looked away from his pregnant girlfriend's gaze and surrendered his responsibility as a father he lost a good deal of his manhood and a great deal of her respect.

He also lost the ability to make decisions. He didn't trust himself to make the right choices and second guessed himself at every turn. So he stopped making them altogether.

As a result his wife ran his life, making all major decisions in the family, and she resented his spineless ineptitude to take charge. He was a coward at work, with his friends, his wife, and eventually his children. No one respected him because he lacked firm resolve.

and his self respect.

He and his ex-wife no longer speak and the children are grown and estranged to him. He's never met his two grandchildren.

One single abortion, with promises of a better future, was supposed to solve all their youthful problems. Ultimately it destroyed two generations of his family and caused endless heartache.

Abortion is a horrible evil. We often say we want better for our daughters, but we should also demand better for our sons too.

Men need to know the lifelong effect abortion can have on their psyches. When men are tested by life and found wanting it ruins their self worth and can potentially damage all their future relationships.

R.'s situation is more than just an anecdotal accounting of abortion. It's backed by psychological research into the subject.

Masculine identity may be damaged when men fail to keep those they love from harm. Role confusion or a sense of emasculation may occur if men are not allowed to act on their healthy instinct to protect or when they judge themselves to have failed as guardians. In an attempt to fulfill their perceived role as one of stoic support to their partners, men tend to contain their own emotions and put on a brave face.

Ironically, men's efforts to be strong for their partners by repressing their own emotions may lead to complicated or unresolved grief or to clinical depression. – Men and Abortion: Psychological Effects by Catherine T. Coyle, RN, PhD

Anything that promises a quick fix to life's challenges always has a higher price to pay in the end. Make sure your sons know that and know that they can come to you for love and support should they ever find themselves in R's position.

Here is a little about my beloved friend...

I can't adequately express my gratitude for Wilma's heroic efforts to bring the ministry of Rachel's Vineyard for healing after abortion to New Mexico many years ago. Because of her efforts, hundreds of women and men made the journey to healing. She planted one seed which flourished and then spread -- first in Santa Fe, then to Pecos Monastery under her capable leadership, after that it branched off to Lubbock Texas which spawned at least 10 other locations and eventually was planted all the way in Honolulu Hawaii! Wilma was determined and committed to protect the gift of life as well as to minister to those who had suffered the unspeakable loss of a child. Wilma had a compassionate heart and put so much effort and energy into providing the healing ministry of Jesus Christ to wounded souls... I know her efforts will continue to bear everlasting fruit.

Although Wilma left her leadership role with Rachel's Vineyard many years ago to raise her beloved family, Wilma and I remained very dear friends as we both continued to have new babies. She was never too busy to pray with me or listen to different challenges I faced as our ministry grew all over the world. As a mother of 5 struggling to juggle it all, I frequently reached out to Wilma, just to ask for prayer because she was another mom so totally devoted to her family, and I knew she understood my situation very well. I always referred to her as a "soul sister" and one that was united to me through many years of mutual prayers and faith sharing.

Wilma never gave up hope! She was a remarkable inspiration and a deeply trusted friend. She had an indomitable spirit – always focused on the needs of others.

I have personally experienced Wilma's gift of intercessory prayer. I considered her a spiritual visionary and she had shared many entries from her spiritual diary with me as we pondered the meaning of suffering in light of our lives as mothers, wives and women of faith who struggled with illness. She offered many bouts of her acute suffering up for me during my own struggle with RSD and offered many prayers for our ministries, especially Grief to Grace for healing sexual abuse. Wilma wanted so much to help with those efforts -- I believe she will continue to intercede for the many causes that meant so much to her because they brought the Love of God into situations of despair and brokenness.

I knew there was a divine grace she offered in the most generous and gracious friendship, no matter what unbearable Cancer treatment she was enduring. Wilma was a beautiful woman. She never stopped sharing the pride and joy that her children gave her and cute stories of so many sweet interactions she shared with them. Wilma treasured every moment – both the good and the bad, inquisitive as to how she could learn and grow spiritually from each situation. She always wanted to be a blessing even in the midst of profound suffering!

To her precious children: Christina, Patricia, Mary, Tony and Sophia – your mom adored all of you. She gives you an amazing example of humility and love, and the gift of her unceasing prayers for your protection. I know her spirit will remain in your hearts during the difficult days ahead. Your mom was a very wise woman – and with her beautiful, sometimes mischievous smile, she knew exactly how to bring forth the best in others. I pray that the gift of her faith takes deeper root in your hearts – Whenever you pray to Jesus, your mom will be right there advocating for you and will always stand beside you in spirit, proudly watching and celebrating your efforts and achievements.
