It was Christmas Eve Day....and the email came in. She had been on our radar for some time and came very close to attending a Rachel's Vineyard retreat this past year, yet even when a driver was sent to her she could not find the courage. She remained on our "care radar" as we continued to encourage her yet she remained in silence.

Then the email came in..."I need a priest. I want to confess this sin."

My immediate mental reaction was...oh no....how am I EVER going to find a priest on Christmas Eve Day. But I told her I would do everything I could as I began to mentally choose the priests with the best chance of locating who might be willing. Then the guidance of searching for the RIGHT priest and not just ANY priest came to my mind. I knew exactly who we needed.

I reached out to him, realizing there was a slim chance. I decided if I didn't hear from him within a few hours I would reach out to the others. Within 30 minutes the phone rang. It was Father!! "Do you still need a priest?" He said. His voice was like the shining star in the dark night calling her to new life.

I set up the time for them to meet in his parish just a few hours later.

I asked her if she would like some company and she said: "I was alone when I had the abortions and I have been alone ever since. I guess so...I have never had anyone to walk through anything with me. I never had the expectation"

I engaged 5 of our Vineyard Keepers who immediately began to pray.

I looked at our GRIP (Graduate of Rachel in parish) list for that parish and contacted two of them. They both responded immediately. Permission was granted and one of them called her and encouraged her and then told her she would be in the front of the Church waiting for her.

I continued in text communication with her letting her know how much she was loved by God to have a priest, two graduates, and 5 vineyard keepers focused on her! She said: "I have lived in such isolation and have avoided people and relationships because I feel so bad about my life and the choices I have made." I pointed out how much God wanted her back and she said: "I know...He

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won't let up...The Holy Spirit has been stirring my soul these past 10 months with a vengeance."

I got a text a few hours later from our graduate telling me that Father and the two graduates were waiting for her at the door. As Father said..."tell her I am the one with the collar on". Regina and I texted back and forth prayerfully wondering if she would have the courage this time...hoping and praying this would be the time. Then I got the best text I could have ever received..."She is here!!! She is now with Father! We are waiting for her in the pew."

I heard later from our potential retreatant that she feels so much better and is now committed to attending a retreat. Her first words to me were: "I have friends now! Father and two wonderful ladies who have invited me to coffee! It was GLORIOUS and WONDERFUL! And my job is actually very close to his parish so I will begin to receive direction from him on my lunch breaks".

I knew then, that this priest chosen to help on this day was NO COINCIDENCE AT ALL!!! God actually cared enough to find one that was just a few miles from work so she could easily continue under his care. I asked her if she could see how much God loves her and she said: "Yes...I can now...He really wanted me back!!" The graduates contacted me and told me they want to sponsor her retreat and will accompany her to the door that day too.

Christmas Eve. Our Lord was born in the heart of a woman who so desperately needed him. We had the star ...we had the shepherds...and the manger this time was a confessional. Praise God! Christmas Eve can happen all over again in ways we never expected!

## **Testimony of Healing By Lauren Zweig Kretzer**

For many years, I sat where you are sitting right now but I had a secret. This secret goes back to when I was a teenager. Like most young people, I did not consider the ramifications of my decisions and how they would impact me for the rest of my life.

When I was 18, I had my first steady boyfriend. After we were together for 8 months, I found out I was pregnant and we went to a clinic to confirm this news. A worker there told me that an abortion would be quick and easy and no one would ever have to find out or get hurt. She said that we should schedule one as soon as possible. She did not tell me about any other alternatives and we made that tragic choice.

A week later on February 6, 1975 we went back to that clinic to abort our baby. I remember feeling nothing emotionally and within the next few months my boyfriend and I broke up.

The abortion set me on a downward spiral. I was grieving my loss but did not know it because the world was telling me there was no need to grieve over what we were told was a bunch of cells. A couple of years later, I married my husband. He knew about the abortion but we both believed that it was buried deep in the past and we wanted to live our new life together.

Women and men who have lost children to abortion often suffer from post- abortive stress (PAS) which is very much like post traumatic stress. This can be serious.

For me, the symptoms and loss were buried deep in my psyche, but then one day something happened to bring this intense pain and repressed memories to the surface.

In 2012 I heard that my old boyfriend had died suddenly. I found myself becoming very depressed. I thought I was going crazy because in all the years leading up to this, I never had any thought or desire to reconnect with him. This depression went on for a couple of months until one

day when I went to my husband. I told him that even though my old boyfriend and I had not spoken since we broke up, we always had a bond. That bond was our baby. I was shocked to hear myself finally speak the truth.

From that moment on, I became a Mom grieving for her baby along with deep shame over what I had done. For a few months I suffered in silence because I thought that I was the only one in the church who had this loss deep in my heart.

I thank God for leading me to Rachel's Vineyard, a ministry for post abortion healing. If it were not for the Rachel's Vineyard retreat I attended in early 2013, I would not be able to stand up here today.

I am so very thankful for the special gift I received from our Lord through this ministry. From my first phone call to Rachel's Vineyard I knew without a doubt that God fully opened the door and that it was the right time in my life for me to be healed.

When I arrived at the retreat I was warmly greeted by the staff, who through the hands of Christ guided me through this wonderful weekend. It was through Rachel's Vineyard that I started on a new journey with the Lord that changed my life.

While I was there I finally had the chance to share my story in a safe, loving place and learned that I was not the only one fooled by the lie of abortion

I also learned that even in the darkest of days, Jesus never gave up on me and never gives up on us. Rachel's Vineyard is a beautiful caress from God that we so desperately need at a time when we feel that we are unworthy of His love and forgiveness. For many of us may just need reassurance that He cares.

Most people who have heard of Rachel's Vineyard think it is only for women like me who have had an abortion. But the truth is that it is for anyone who has suffered the loss of a child by abortion, miscarriage, or still birth. It is not only for the Mom and Dad who carry the secret shameful scars along with the grief that is buried deep in their core. It is also for their families and friends who feel the loss in their lives. It is for the grandparents grieving over grandchildren they will never get to hug and spoil.

If you, or someone you love, have been feeling ashamed over their own experience, they need to know that they are not alone. There is nothing that is outside of God's reach. We, at Rachel's Vineyard will always keep everything confidential along with a promise that none of us are in a position to judge.

# A Catholic Deacon in Post-Abortion Ministry

Deacon Mark Armamentos serves as a Catholic Deacon in the Diocese of Joliet, Illinois. In the following interview, we discover that within his calling to the Deaconate, Rev. Armamentos found another very special invitation from the Lord.

### **How did you come to discover God's call to the Catholic Deaconate?**

For a couple of years many people, from various ministries I was involved with, asked me if I considered being a deacon, to which I responded “no”. After a person had asked me a couple times about it, I said I would pray about it, but nothing further came of it.

During a weekend retreat for teenagers, I was giving a talk about sharing our faith with others and proclaimed to the participants, “God is always talking to us, through our parents, friends, nature, etc. We just have to listen with open hearts.” As I said those words, I instantly realized that God had been talking to me through a number of people...but I had not been really listening. After discussing it with my wife and family, I came to believe that the call was genuinely from God and I decided to apply. On a funny note, my eldest daughter said, “Gee dad, it’s about time!”

The blessings since that time have been too numerous to count; my marriage is better and it was already very good, my love for Jesus has grown, my faith in Him has deepened, and my desire to serve more boldly than before has really blossomed. I look up to Heaven and say, “I am a dull butter knife Lord, but you can always make good use of me ...as long as I am blessed to keep saying Yes!

### **You received another special calling to serve as a Deacon in ministry for those with abortion loss. How did you make that connection?**

There was an email from our diocese to all deacons asking if anyone would be available to serve on an upcoming Rachel’s Vineyard Retreat. (My wife read it before I did.) Later that night when I read my emails, the invitation really grabbed my heart. I looked over at my wife and said, “Would you mind if, I...” and before I finished my request she said that she had hoped that I would feel called to go. Once I had her blessing, I responded and met the team a couple days before the retreat.

I felt overwhelmed at first, but believed that the Holy Spirit would guide me and use me to help in the healing process of the women and men on the retreat.

### **What was the retreat experience like for you?**

The retreat itself was amazing beyond belief! I met women and men on Friday who were hurting and broken and I witnessed a transformation like the Lord’s Resurrection. Friday, and Saturday too, they moved through the suffering of their lives, as if moving through the darkness of a tomb. A lot of the past had to be addressed head-on; a lot of work had to be done.

But by Sunday, a transformation had occurred! These women and men were on the path towards healing. They believed that God loved them. They believed that God had forgiven them. They even began to believe that they could eventually forgive themselves. I saw parents who were again ready to begin to live lives of joy that God desires for them.

It was gut-wrenching to be so intimately connected with such grievous wounds. It was one of the greatest blessings of my life to have been a part of it all, from pain, to more pain, through a river and then a veritable ocean of tears...and finally to a faint smile that blossomed into a bunch of

radiant, glowing mothers and fathers, unburdened of years, even decades of torment.

**Do you see post abortion healing and the Rachel's Vineyard retreat as a good fit for the Deaconate ministry? What special advice would you have for those discerning service in this outreach?**

The diaconate is foremost a ministry of service. Rachel's Vineyard is not only a good, but it is a great fit for a deacon. But it's important to note that each of us has our special gifts. Just as with any ministry, sometimes it's a good fit, other times there is another type of service that will be a better match.

A Deacon in this ministry must be a man who is utterly trusting in the Lord, perfectly willing to be extremely uncomfortable, and be able to relate very well with women as well as men who are dealing with some intense feelings, often troubled history, and deep grief. God commissioned us to serve everyone but especially those of his sons and daughters on the margins of society. It is hard to imagine people more on the margin of society than those who shun themselves from experiencing joy, who exile themselves from experiencing love.

**What is most rewarding about serving in Rachel's Vineyard ministry?**

Those who come to participate in these weekend programs are so brave to admit they need God and that they need healing; frankly, most of us need God desperately but we have not faced the crisis that these parents have and therefore we still mistakenly believe that we can "fix things ourselves." Seeing and getting to know women and men who know they need healing, who know they are broken, who sense somehow that God, and His mercy, and His forgiveness are what they need to heal is such a blessing. It is a great joy to see them go through the retreat and experience so much of God's love through the Living Scriptures Exercises (special scripture meditations developed by Rachel's Vineyard founder Dr Theresa Burke,) and sharing and listening to others who have shared a similar dark journey.

**What is most challenging?**

It is very hard to listen to the stories of these women and men's lives. Many have been so abused, so unloved. It breaks my heart to hear how beastly some people can be to one another. And, yet, it is like the Cross; there is no around it, there is no way over it, there is no way under it... there is only through it. The women, the team, and me, we all must walk the painful journey, like the road to Calvary together; a road of bad choices and horrific consequences and yet this dark road leads to the blazing light of transformation on Sunday, just like Easter Sunday.

**How are you received by the retreat participants?**

Whatever their initial reservations might be seeing a man and Deacon on the team, the retreat participants very soon get a sense that I am a servant who is there to help them without judgment, with only mercy and compassion. By Sunday afternoon, the tears are joyous and the hugs are plentiful all around.

**Do you have an opportunity to share your RV experience with other Clergy? Has your Rachel's Vineyard ministry experience influenced your preaching and if so how is this received by the parishioners?**

I met with my pastor and my fellow deacons at my parish after each retreat to tell them how transformative it was not only for the participants, but for me as well. I have preached a number of times regarding abortion and healing, always focusing much more on the healing. I was astounded by the reaction as many women and men came up to me and thanked me for speaking so boldly about this. Many women and men shared with me that they had abortions or participated in one or more; some had been on a Rachel's Vineyard retreat and said it had helped them tremendously and

others said they would consider it. I received no negative responses at all.




