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## **Healing Vines**

### **Jason Baier, Founder of Fatherhood Forever**

For the ten years following the loss of my child to abortion, I worked very hard to recover from my experiences. I had done just about everything there is to do starting with visits to a psychiatrist and a counselor, spending time in the hospital, and taking all sorts of anti-depressants and other medications. When those things didn't work, I then turned to "alternative means" by first finding a church, then participating in a 12-step program and various support groups, reading books relating to my problems, delving into bible studies, and taking time each day to pray.

Finally, in 2005, I determined I was healed and started the Fatherhood Forever Foundation to help others find hope and healing as I had. Since then I've met so many wonderful people in pro-life and post-abortive ministries. I've had the privilege of helping others on their path to healing. I've been honored to share my story before groups of pro-lifers, churches, youth and the general public.

In February of 2006, I had the opportunity to attend a Rachel's Vineyard weekend retreat. I attended the retreat on the basis that I would learn more about this ministry listed in our Men's Healing Network and to see if it was something I'd be interested in helping with. My sole purpose for attending was to conduct "research." Little did I realize what I had gotten myself into.

When I arrived at the retreat, I put on a big smile and acted as though I had no concerns about what would happen during the weekend. I'll admit I was a bit nervous, but couldn't put my finger on the reason why. I was relieved to discover I wasn't the only guy that would be attending. The retreat location was absolutely beautiful and I was soon at ease with the whole idea of spending the weekend there. That is until the retreat officially started.

Within minutes of starting, I found myself putting up barriers. I became stone-faced and sat with my arms crossed in defiance; attempting to resist any emotion the staff might be trying to pull from me. "I'm already healed," I thought to myself. "There's nothing they can do or say to make me think otherwise." My pride got the best of me, to the point that I felt compelled to express my "discomfort" with one of the staff members during a break. Her simple words of comfort and understanding quickly put me at ease. When I went to bed that night, I told myself that although I was going to be strong, I would at least be more open tomorrow.

And then tomorrow arrived. So much for strong. I came to realize that I still had a great deal of unresolved anger toward the mother of my child, who I thought I had forgiven, and guilt for not being able to prevent the abortion. But my emotional breaking point was when I discovered I still had sorrow and despair buried deep within my heart. I hadn't cried that hard since the day I lost my child. I cried not only for the loss of my child, but for having fooled myself into believing I was healed. I was angry and ashamed with myself.

It was at my weakest point of the weekend that nothing short of a miracle occurred. I was suddenly overcome with a sense of peace that I had only experienced once before in my life. I embraced these emotions and let all my pain and anger go. For the first time ever, I was able to see clearly and know that I had reason to be happy rather than mourn. I was able to put to rest all those thoughts and feelings that were holding me back from being the person I was meant to be. My eyes were fully opened.

Since the retreat, I've had new revelations and convictions that have paved the way for a brighter future. I've discovered truths I had been blind to in the past which have raised me up in faith and hope. February has always been a difficult month for me, but this year instead of grieving over my loss, I rejoiced in what I had gained.

If you are post-abortive, I wholeheartedly encourage you to attend a Rachel's Vineyard retreat. There's so much to be gained from it. If you work in ministry, I encourage you to lead those in need of healing to a retreat. 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### **Tennis Pro Jimmy Connors – The Outsider in His Own Abortion Story Kevin Burke**

*You can shine your shoes and wear a suit  
You can comb your hair and look quite cute  
You can hide your face behind a smile  
One thing you can't hide

With the release of Tennis pro Jimmy Connors autobiography, *The Outsider* we learn of an unplanned pregnancy and abortion with fellow pro Chris Evert when they were young sweethearts engaged to be married.

With a superficial reading of the account from his book, you might conclude that Connors was a stand up guy when he learned of the pregnancy. He appears open to the responsibility of fathering their child, and upset by his lack of say in the decision to abort:

“An issue had arisen as a result of youthful passion, and a decision had to be made as a couple,” he writes in *The Outsider*. “Chrissie called to say she was coming out to LA to take care of the ‘issue.’ I was perfectly happy to let nature take its course and accept responsibility for what was to come.”

But Connors says Chrissie made a unilateral decision and he was powerless to stop her. “Chrissie, however, had already made up her mind that the timing was bad and too much was riding on her future,” he writes. “She asked me to handle the details.”

The next exchange between the couple likely sealed the fate of their unborn child:

Connors says he told Chris: “Well, thanks for letting me know. Since I

don't have any say in the matter, I guess I am just here to help."

And so it was. The Outsider "handled the details" and arranged for the abortion of his unborn son or daughter.

Pro abortion advocates proclaim as some self-evident dictate delivered from on high that "abortion is a private personal decision between a woman, her health care provider and her God." It is true that current law ensures that the father of the child has no legal rights to defend the life of his unborn baby. (This can be a very painful reality that will devastate a man when he desperately tries to prevent an abortion.)

But that doesn't mean the father's response to the pregnancy is not important. Based on firsthand experience and research with thousands of women who made abortion decisions, the truth is that in 95% of these situations the response of the father to the pregnancy is a key factor in her decision to have or not have an abortion.

When Evert approached Connors with her mind seemingly made up, he made a serious and deadly mistake many fathers make during this challenging and emotional time for a young couple...he fails to fight for the life of his child. This sends a clear signal to the mother who may hear in his response:

"I am open to you having the baby, but I'm not going to fight too hard to protect the child and I may or may not be around to help...so if you're minds made up anyway, I'll respect whatever you decide."

There is no guarantee that Evert would have changed her mind if Connors was more determined to fight for the child's life. But it was the best hope their baby had for survival. Once the father communicates ambivalence and does not strongly express the natural desire to protect his offspring, the mother may understandably fear making the sacrifices of single parenting unsure if the father will continue to love and support them both. Women also understandably fear the resentment and anger a man may express later when facing the responsibilities and stress of an unplanned child.

"It was a horrible feeling, but I knew it was over," Connors writes. "Getting married wasn't going to be good for either of us."

Rather than the joy of youthful love and passion and anticipation of married life together, the couple now shared a dark secret...a participation in the death of their unborn son or daughter.

Like Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden, they were offered the Apple of Choice, with the alluring promise to attain a type of Divine Providence over life and death, empowered and free to be Lords of their own lives.

Both tennis pros went on to stellar careers. On the surface it may appear that they "made the right decision." But like many couples after abortion,

the fruit of this tragic choice is evident as their lives unfold.

Connors, now 60, struggled with a gambling addiction and the infidelities that "came that close to ruining his marriage" to former Playboy model Patti McGuire. Men, who later regret, reconcile and heal of a previous abortion decision report that along with addictions and infidelity, anger was a way they repressed and expressed their painful emotions such as guilt and complicated grief. Perhaps some of Connors on and off-court anger issues and fireworks can be understood as a way he expressed some of the powerful emotions men can feel after abortion.

Evert also exhibits common symptoms of post abortion complications...instability in intimate relationships. Chrissie, now 58 married three times. All three marriages ended in divorce.

Sadly if this couple were offered education and resources for recovery after abortion they could have attended a healing program and found reconciliation and peace with their loss and help alleviate the emotional suffering, and relationship problems common for many women and men after abortion.

Abortion is a life changing, and soul-changing event that strikes at the deepest part of the human person. The abortion account of Jimmy Connors and Chris Evert reflects on a much grander stage, what has been the experience of millions of young couples. They valiantly press on with their lives, perhaps like Connors and Evert achieving great success as they struggle to bury that abortion event deep in their past.

But the symptoms of their post abortion lives if properly understood, are calling them to reconcile and heal of this loss, buried deep in their hearts and souls.

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## **MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT: RACHEL'S VINEYARD**

The factors involved in deciding on going through with an abortion are nothing short of complex. The circumstances and people involved are varied. And after the act, the sense of loss, regret, and guilt can be overwhelming. It was to address the trauma after abortion that gave rise to the ministry of Rachel's Vineyard.

In 1996, Dr. Theresa Karminski Burke put together a support group model/curriculum for leaders and clergy so that they could better deal with those who had experienced abortion. Out of this model, came about weekend retreats, which soon, through word-of-mouth extended to people who had first-hand experiences with an abortion. Soon, people from across the country came seeking healing. Individuals were not limited to women directly involved with the abortion, but also other family members of the aborted child such as siblings, fathers, and grandparents.

As the ministry literature says, "the program is an opportunity to examine your abortion experience, identify the ways that the loss has impacted you in the past and present, and helps to acknowledge any unresolved feelings that many individuals struggle with after abortion. Because of the emotional numbness and secrecy that often surrounds an abortion experience, conflicting emotions both during and after the event may remain unresolved. These buried feelings can surface later and may be symptoms of post abortion trauma."

Working in youth ministry since she was nineteen, Dr. Burke has always been a group-person. She strongly believes in the power of the group. Through her research and work, she found that when women had one-on-one therapy sessions in regards to their abortion, it reinforced the shame of the act. In providing a group dynamic—which a lot of naysayers proclaimed would not work—Rachel's Vineyard provided a safe, judgment-free setting for people to share their personal experience. There was power and comfort in numbers. Since its inception and still today, retreats are filled by those seeking healing in this kind of setting.

Each retreat has a priest in attendance. And one of the main objectives is to reinforce that although individuals have undergone or experienced this traumatic event, that God loves them and that God has not forsaken them. Through Scriptures, Rachel's Vineyard helps those who seek healing to find healing in the Lord.

When the ministry began, it was run out of the Burke's home. Suffering through illness and taking care of small children for several years, Dr. Burke, nevertheless, believed in the work that she was doing. Without a non-profit status at that time, the Burkes spent their own funds to cover the ministry's costs. Mr. Burke managed a maternity home that always had half its beds free. So the weekend retreats were eventually held

there.

After a few years, realizing that the work was more than she could handle alone, Dr. Burke reached out to another pro-life organization for assistance. However, sometimes when it rains, it pours, and Dr. Burke's experience with that organization left her wanting to quit the ministry altogether.

It was God's providence that intervened through Father Frank Pavone, the National Director of Priests for Life. Father Pavone had attended a weekend retreat and heard of Dr. Burke's troubles. He said to her, "The work that you do is too important. We will help." With that, Rachel's Vineyard became a non-profit ministry of Priests for Life. Dr. Burke serves as the Executive Director.

Offering healing through God's word, Rachel's Vineyard is now in 57 countries, 48 states in the U.S., with 325 worldwide sites, offering 1000 retreats annually. The informational literature is being translated into 29 languages. Dr. Burke says that it is through the dedication of nearly 100,000 volunteers that the ministry has grown in such a way. Only five percent of those involved with Rachel's Vineyard are paid staff. The remainders are those who are dedicating their time and skills to the cause of helping those affected by abortion.

God has destined certain ministries to be fruitful because the work that they do glorify His name. Tested through fire, ministries such as these, like Rachel's Vineyard, continue to help, heal, and share the message of God's love and salvation to all His children.
