Idaho	Contact County Clerk for dates and times. Early voting closes the day before the election.

Indiana	4-5 to 5-3	10-4 to 11-1
Iowa	Begins as soon as ballots are available and ends on Election Day.	
Kansas	Begins 7 to 20 days before the election, depending on the county, and continues until noon, the day before the election.	
Louisiana	8-14 to 8-21	10-19 to 10-26
Maine	Begins as soon as ballots are available (usually 30-45 days before the election) and ends on Election Day.	
Maryland	9-3 to 9-9	10-22 to 10-28
Montana	Begins as soon as ballots are available and ends the day before the election.

Oklahoma	7-23 to 7-26	10-29 to 11-1
South Dakota	Begins as soon as ballots are available and ends on Election Day.	
Tennessee	7-16 to 7-31	10-13 to 10-28
Texas	2-13 to 2-26	10-16 to 10-29
Utah	6-8 to 6-18	10-19 to 10-29
Vermont	8-16 to 9-14	10-4 to 11-2
West Virginia	4-21 to 5-8	10-13 to 10-30
Wisconsin	Begins as soon as ballots are available (usually 3 weeks before the election) and ends the day before the election.	
Wyoming	7-8 to 8-17	9-23 to 11-2
