Priests for Life activities at March for Life in D.C., Walk for Life in San Francisco

Priests for Life organizes and helps to lead a number of events associated with the annual March for Life in Washington and Walk for Life West Coast in San Francisco. Join us at any or all of the events listed here. If you can't be there in person, follow the events live at www.EndAbortion.TV and on the various social media and video platforms linked from there!

- Jan. 20, 9 a.m., Priests for Life will lead a prayerful protest at Planned Parenthood, 1225 Fourth Street NE.
- Jan. 21, 8:30 a.m., the National Prayer Service at Constitution Hall will honor pro-life legislators and residents of Texas and Mississippi who were responsible for passing life-saving laws in those states. 1776 D St. NW.
- Jan. 21, noon, the March for Life Rally will begin, to be followed by the march along Constitution Avenue. Members of Silent No More will walk together, holding their "I Regret My Abortion" or "I Regret Lost Fatherhood" signs aloft.
- Jan. 21, 2:30 p.m. (approximate). Testimonies from the women and men of Silent No More in front of the Supreme Court.
- Jan. 19-21, Priests for Life will have a booth at the March for Life Expo at the Renaissance Washington D.C. Downtown Hotel, 999 Ninth St. NW.
- Jan. 22, 9 a.m., members of Silent No More will give their testimony in front of the U.S. Supreme

Court building to commemorate the anniversary of Roe v. Wade.

- Jan. 22, Priests for Life will have exhibit booths at the Students for Life Conference at the Omni Shoreham Hotel in D.C., and at the Cardinal O'Connor Conference at Georgetown University.

Also, on Jan. 22, Fr. Frank Pavone and Bryan Kemper will be at the Walk for Life West Coast and help lead the gathering of the Silent No More Awareness Campaign. Priests for Life and its Stand True Youth Outreach will have an exhibit booth throughout the event.

Prior to the walk, at 8 a.m. PT, Father Frank and Mr. Kemper will speak at a protest rally outside Planned Parenthood at 1650 Valencia Street in San Francisco. Tragic Roe v. Wade anniversary has **special significance for Silent No More** member

The year 2022 has special significance for Mary Kominsky of the Silent No More Awareness Campaign: The child she aborted in 1972 would be turning 50 this year.

At the Silent No More gathering at this year's March for Life in Washington, D.C., Mrs. Kominsky will talk about the abortion she had as a 17-year-old, leaving her home state of New Jersey and taking a bus to New York, where abortion was legal even before the Roe v. Wade decision in 1973.

When her pregnancy was confirmed at a Planned Parenthood in New Jersey, "fear took over my body and my soul," she said. She was assured that her 11-week-pregnancy could be terminated and her life restored.

Instead, her life was irrevocably altered.

"After an abortion, the body remembers, because the womb is the heart of the woman, a sacred place where any assault leaves lasting damage," she said. "I had to detach my mind, my heart and my emotions. In shutting these off, my heart hardened and turned cold. Initially there is a relief of not having to face uncertainty, but that often turns to great sadness. I became angry and resentful to all those around me. I had a deep shame and a profound sense of loss."

Mrs. Kominsky's testimony on Jan. 21 will be among those given by women and men of Silent No More in front of the U.S. Supreme Court building as the March for Life reaches that point. The testimonies have become an integral part of the annual mass protest of Roe v. Wade.

Silent No More is a joint project of Priests for Life and Anglicans for Life.

One-year anniversary of the Geneva Consensus Declaration

Priests for Life was happy to have Intergovernmental Representative Bob Lalonde stand with the Institute for Women's Health in commemorating the one-year

anniversary of the Geneva Consensus Declaration. The Declaration promoting Women's Health, Life, Family, and National Sovereignty has thirty-five country signatories. The Declaration which proclaims that "human rights extend to unborn children" was signed by the United States during the Trump administration only to be withdrawn by Biden's in his first week in office. The Declaration however remains intact and two new countries, Guatemala and Russia have just joined the coalition. With Valerie Huber and The Institute for Women's Health continuing to promote the Declaration, we are expecting the international coalition to continue to grow.

Convergence

Each January, three observances converge that reinforce each other and summon the Christian world to work together against injustice. January 15 is the birthday of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and on or around that day we observe a national holiday in his honor. A week later, on January 22, we recall the tragic decision made that day in 1973 by the Supreme Court in Roe vs. Wade, unleashing a policy of abortion on demand. On or around January 22, large rallies and marches for life are held from coast to coast. And from January 18 to 25th each year, the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is observed.

These three great movements are deeply intertwined.

Jesus Christ prayed that his followers would be one, as he

and the Father are one. Authentic Christian unity does not mean pretending there are no serious doctrinal disagreements between denominations. It does mean working to come to a deeper understanding of what those differences are and are not, as well as recognizing and building on the real unity that does exist in our common affirmation of Christ and his Lordship in our lives and in the world.

That affirmation of Christ requires that we work to fight injustice. In his encyclical letter on Christian Unity, issued in 1995, Pope John Paul II wrote, "Many Christians from all Communities, by reason of their faith, are jointly involved in bold projects aimed at changing the world by inculcating respect for the rights and needs of everyone, especially the poor, the lowly, and the defenseless... Christians who once acted independently are now engaged together in the service of this cause, so that God's mercy may triumph" (n. 43).

Both the civil rights movement and the pro-life movement are evidence of this common engagement. Both movements seek to secure equal rights for marginalized human beings, despite their appearances, and to apply to law and culture the promises of the Gospel. Both movements have found their "meeting place" and their "launching pad" in the Churches, manifesting this declaration of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.:

"I'm always happy to see a relevant ministry. It's alright to talk about 'long white robes over yonder,' in all of its symbolism. But ultimately people want some suits and dresses and shoes to wear down here. It's alright to talk about 'streets flowing with milk and honey,' but God has commanded us to be concerned about the slums down here, and his children who can't eat three square meals a day. It's alright to talk about the new Jerusalem, but one day, God's preacher must talk about the new New York, the new Atlanta, the new Philadelphia, the new Los Angeles, the new Memphis, Tennessee. This is what we have to do."

Defending the equal dignity of every human being after birth strengthens our witness to the rights of those in danger before birth, and vice-versa. The witness, in fact, is ultimately one: the witness to the one Christ, who restores dignity to every human life.


